**AN ORDINANCE NO. 34,653—Ratifying, approving and confirming the sale of part of lot 14, Evans & Cheetham's amended subdivision, to George B. Wilson and Maggie L. Wilson.**

Whereas, By ordinance No. 33,653, passed October 30, 1922, a tract of ground 14.64 north and south by 72.50 east and west out of the southeast corner of lot 14, Evans & Cheetham's amended plat of A. L. Evans subdivision of lot 41 of H. T. Chittenden's addition, plat book 3, page 76, was authorized to be sold by the board of purchase, after advertisement of bids therefor, and,

Whereas, After said advertisement for bids said property was sold to George B. Wilson and Maggie L. Wilson by deed signed December 20, 1922, and recorded in deed book 726, page 264, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, and,

Whereas, The advertisement was not had for the length of time required by law prior to the opening of bids for the sale of said property; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus (two-thirds of all members elected thereto concurring):

**AN ORDINANCE NO. 34,654—To vacate 23.50 feet off the west end of the eight foot alley along the south side of J. F. Stallsmith's first addition and alley 13.50 feet wide running south from the south line of Jason avenue 102 feet adjoining the west side of lot 15 of said Stallsmith's first addition.**

Whereas, On the 10th day of De-

ember, 1923, a petition by the owner of all the land abutting on the lands described in the title hereto and herein-after described, was duly presented to council praying that said portion of said alleys be vacated, and,

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for said vacation as prayed for and that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That 23.50 feet off the west end of the eight foot alley along the south side of J. F. Stallsmith's first addition and alley 13.50 feet wide running south from the south line of Jason avenue 102 feet adjoining the west side of lot 15 of said Stallsmith's first addition, and shown on said addition as reserve "C", as recorded in plat book 10, page 102, Franklin county plat records, be and the same are hereby vacated.

**AN ORDINANCE NO. 34,656—To vacate the first alley north of Hawthorne avenue, extending east from the east line of Champion avenue, 270.5 feet to the west line of a 30 foot street; and an alley located 140 feet east of the east line of Champion avenue, and extending north from the north line of the first alley north of Hawthorne avenue, 92.78 feet.**

Whereas, On the 10th day of December, 1923, there was duly presented to council a petition and written consent signed by the owner of all the land abutting on two certain alleys described as follows:

1st. The first alley north of Hawthorne avenue, extending east from the east line of Champion avenue, 270.5 feet to the west line of a 30 foot street.

2nd. Being located 140 feet east of the east line of Champion avenue, and extending north from the north line of the first alley north of Hawthorne avenue, 92.78 feet.

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for said vacation as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the two alleys in the city of Columbus, Ohio, bounded as follows:

1st. The first alley north of Hawthorne avenue, extending east from the east line of Champion avenue, 270.5 feet to the west line of a 30 foot street.

2nd. Being located 140 feet east of the east line of Champion avenue, and extending north from the north line of the first alley north of Hawthorne avenue, 92.78 feet, be and the same are hereby vacated, subject to the right of said city and its inhabitants to continue the occupation of said ground or any part thereof by the use, maintenance and operation of all sewers and water pipes located therein, and do all things necessary to the operation, maintenance or construction of anything appurtenant to said sewers or water pipes, and subject further to the provision and obligation that at no time shall any part of either sewers or said water pipes be in any way covered over, either by buildings or otherwise whatsoever.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**AN ORDINANCE NO. 34,657—Authorizing and directing the payment of the claim of the Reporter Publishing company.**

Whereas, By ordinances Nos. 33,529, 34,114, 34,155 and 34,463, passed by the city council on April 23, 1923, May 7, 1923, May 15, 1923, and September 17, 1923, respectively, certain territories were authorized to be annexed to the city of Columbus and the city attorney was directed to prosecute the proceedings for said annexations, and,

Whereas, In connection with the prosecution of said annexations and in accordance with the requirements of the general code of Ohio, the city attorney caused certain notices to be published, and,

Whereas, Said notices were published at various times in accordance with the requirements of the general code of Ohio by the Reporter Publishing company in the Daily Reporter, for the reasonable sum of \$126.25; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the claim of the Reporter Publishing company in the sum of \$126.25, for the publishing of the above mentioned notices of annexation, be and the same is hereby recognized as a moral obligation and legal claim against the city of Columbus.

Sec. 2. That from the moneys now in the general fund and from all moneys estimated to come into said fund during the balance of the twelve months ending December 31, 1923, from any and all sources, and not otherwise appropriated, there be and there hereby is appropriated the sum of \$126.25 for the payment of the above claim.

Sec. 3. That upon voucher approved by the city attorney, the city auditor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the city treasurer for the sum of \$126.25, payable to the Reporter Publishing company.

Sec. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**AN ORDINANCE NO. 34,658—Authorizing the sale of certain old houses and buildings belonging to the city of Columbus not needed for any municipal purpose.**

Whereas, In the ordinary daily course of business of the department of public service the sale of the following property along the east bank of the Scioto river is immediately necessary in order that the improvement of the east bank of said river may be completed at an early date, harmonious with the flood protection work, and is therefore necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following described property belonging to the city of Columbus is not needed for any municipal purpose, to-wit:

Frame buildings known as Nos. 144, 144½, 146, 148, 150, 152, 154 and 154½ West Rich street; further described as the buildings on the north side of West Rich street, running from Ide Terrace to the river front.

Sec. 2. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized to sell said property to the highest bidder according to law upon the following terms: cash.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.
