

of said alley. Said grantee shall maintain said catch basin in good repair at all times.

Sec. 2. That said catch basin shall be constructed, used and maintained, subject to the further condition that the Donaldson Baking company, its successors and assigns, shall keep and save harmless the city of Columbus from any and all claims for damages which may arise or grow out of such construction, and shall defend at its own cost and expense each and every suit which may be brought or prosecuted against the city of Columbus for the recovery of any or all damages arising from such construction, use and maintenance. The grant herein conveyed is made with the understanding that the occupancy of said alley by said catch basin is permitted merely as an accommodation and that no right, title or interest of the public is abridged thereby.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, upon the filing with the clerk of this council by the grantee its acceptance, in writing, of each and all of the terms, provisions and requirements of this ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE No. 349-51—To authorize the director of public service to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the improvement of the intersection of Olentangy boulevard and Goodale street, and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of engineering and construction, in that it is necessary to improve the intersection of Olentangy boulevard and Goodale street, in order to protect the public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the improvement of the intersection of Olentangy boulevard and Goodale street, by grading, draining, constructing Portland cement concrete pavement, concrete curb and sidewalk, and doing such other work as may be necessary to complete the improvement, in accordance with the plans therefor marked 733, drawer E, and the specifications therefor, on file in the office of the director of public service, which are hereby approved.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$4,000, or so much thereof as may be needed, be and it is hereby appropriated from the maintenance and repair No. 65-602 fund, to the intersection of Olentangy boulevard and Goodale street improvement fund, to pay the cost thereof.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 350-51—To authorize and direct the board of purchase to purchase one Model R-D-R-1 Omega Rotodip Feeder with rubber covered dipper wheel and rubber lined feeder tank with variable feed transmission, totalizer, 1/4 H.P. 60 cycle, 110 volt, single phase motor and switch, complete with hard rubber valve and

float; the feeder provided with a constant level overflow opening in the event it is used without float or hard rubber valve, for use at the water softening and filtration plant, division of water, No. 90, department of public service, and to appropriate the funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, section 3965 of the general code of Ohio provides in case of emergency by a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected concurring, the council may authorize the board of purchase to purchase materials without advertising; and

Whereas, the Omega Machine Company, Providence, R.I., (H.R. Bowers & Company, Cleveland, Ohio agent) is the only known manufacturer of suitable alum feeding equipment of this type, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of water, No. 90, department of public service, in that the Rotodip feeder is immediately necessary for feeding alum to the water supply at a new point of application at the water softening and filtration plant, and for the immediate preservation of public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Two-thirds of all the members elected thereto concurring:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to purchase, without advertising for bids, one Model R-D-R-1 Omega Rotodip Feeder with rubber covered dipper wheel and rubber lined feeder tank with variable feed transmission, totalizer, 1/4 H.P. 60 cycle, 110 volt, single phase motor and switch, complete with hard rubber valve and float; the feeder provided with a constant level overflow opening in the event it is used without float or hard rubber valve, for use at the water softening and filtration plant, division of water, No. 90, department of public service.

Sec. 2. That the only source of supply for the above named feeder is the Omega Machine Company, Providence, R.I., (H.R. Bowers & Company, Cleveland, Ohio agent).

Sec. 3. That the sum of \$1,500 or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated from division of water, No. 90, code 700, department of public service, to pay the cost thereof.

Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure which shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 351-51—To authorize and direct the director of public service to enter into contract, or contracts, with the board of county commissioners, Franklin county, State of Ohio, for street lighting service furnished by the city of Columbus thru the division of electricity, department of public service, on various streets, roads, etc.

Whereas, in the installation and operation of the street lighting system in the city of Columbus, it is desirable that street lighting facilities and service be provided on various streets, roads, etc. which are bounded, on one side by properties located within the city of Columbus, Ohio, and on the opposite side, by properties located within Franklin county, Ohio; thereby making any such streets, roads, etc., a common facility for both the said city and the said county abutting properties, and

Whereas, because of the common use of the aforesaid street lighting facilities

and service by the city of Columbus and said county, the latter should reimburse the city of Columbus for its proportionate share of the expense in connection therewith, now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and hereby is authorized and directed to enter into contract, or contracts, with the board of county commissioners, Franklin county, State of Ohio, for the furnishing of street lighting facilities and service on various streets, roads, etc. which are bounded on one side by properties located within the city of Columbus, Ohio, and on the opposite side, by properties located within Franklin county, Ohio; at an annual rate of \$12 per year for each 2500 lumen Utilitarian street lighting fixture installed, maintained, and operated; which amount shall be paid to the division of electricity fund No. 82, in equal monthly installments upon receipt of invoices therefor.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
