COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Regular Meeting, Monday, Dec. 21, 1925

Council met in regular session with President Zimpfer in the chair and City Clerk Turner present. Roll call showed all members of council in their places.

The planning commission submitted advice of action taken on several petitions to change the zoning of certain sections. Service.

W. W. Wheaton, Geo. T. Harrod and Al. Shawaker, estimating board, reported the final estimated assessment for the following improvements: Alley west of Avondale avenue, Capital to State; Carrie avenue, Kendall to Loeffler; Champion avenue, Whittier to south corporation line; Cleveland avenue storm sewer relief; Cliffside drive, Parkview to Indianola; alley north of Eighth avenue, Worthington to Highland; alley west of Galloway avenue, Leonard to alley north of Caldwell; alley west of Garfield avenue, Buckingham to Atcheson; alley north of Hanford street, Fourth to Jaeger; alley west of Harrison avenue, alley north of Buttles to second alley north of Buttles; Hinman avenue, Parsons to Ann; Jason avenue, Dorris to Milton; Jefferson avenue, Buckingham to Leonard; Kent street, Kelton to east terminus; alley west of Linwood avenue, Fair to Oak; alley north of Long street, Mink to Winner; Melrose avenue, Indianola to C. D. & M. railway; alley west of Neil avenue, Collins to alley north of Collins; alley north of Oak street, Wilson to Linwood; alley west of Oregon avenue, Third to Fourth; Park street, Goodale to Buttles; alley north of Patterson avenue, Williams to Neil; Pearl street, Eleventh to Chittenden; Pearl street, alley north of Woodruff to Frambes;

Reinhard avenue, City Park to Parsons; alley north of Reinhard avenue, Jaeger to Parsons; alley north of Second avenue, Delaware to Harrison; Sixth street, Moler to Jenkins; alley west of Sixth street, Main to Noble; alley north of Smith place, alley west of High to Dennison; Swayne street, Parsons to Wager; alley north of Third avenue, alley west of Neil to Harrison; alley west of Wager street, Swayne to Jackson; alley west of Wesley avenue, Eighth to Ninth; alley north of Whittier street, Beech to Pine, and alley north of Woodruff avenue, Waldeck to Pearl. Placed on file.

Orin H. Croft and four others presented a petition to change the zoning of the north side of West Broad street, Westmoor to New, to a business section. Planning commission.

Frank E. Powell presented a petition to extend the business zoning on the south side of West Broad street, Chase to a point one hundred and forty-five feet west. Planning commission.

E. R. Cochran submitted a request to have the name of Piedmont road placed on a standard at Torrence and High. Service.

A. Shawaker submitted a request that Rich street, Fifth to Parsons, be included in the 1926 paving program. Service.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 36,835—To dedicate property for the opening and extending of Spring street, from Grant avenue to Cleveland avenue.

Whereas, Council by ordinances Nos. 36,409, 36,588 and 36,657, passed June 15, 1925, August 7, 1925, and September 21, 1925, respectively, authorized the acquisition of certain property for the opening and extending of Spring street, from Grant avenue to Cleveland avenue, and

Whereas, Said property has now been acquired; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the five parcels of land lying between the east line of Grant avenue and the west line of Cleveland avenue and further described as follows:

Parcel No. 1

Being lot No. 5 of Thomas Cadwallader's subdivision of outlots 83 and 84 of the city of Columbus, Ohio, as the same is numbered and delineated on the plat thereof, recorded in deed record No. 32, page 440, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio;

Parcel No. 2

Being the north half of lot No. 3 of Thomas Cadwallader's subdivision of outlots 83 and 84 of the city of Columbus, Ohio, as the same is numbered and delineated on the plat thereof, recorded in deed record No. 32, page 440, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio;

Parcel No. 3

Situated in the state of Ohio, county of Franklin and city of Columbus, and being lot No. 6 and 5.1 feet off the north side of lot No. 4 of Thomas Cadwallader's subdivision of outlots 83 and 84 of the city of Columbus, Ohio, as numbered and delineated upon the recorded plat thereof, of record in deed book 32, page 440, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio;
