

Section 1. That the right and privilege is hereby granted to John E. McCrehen to construct and maintain two 5000-gallon fuel oil tanks under the sidewalk at the northeast corner of Walnut and Scioto streets, said construction and maintenance to be in accordance with the plans and specifications to be approved by the chief of the fire department and the director of public service. The sidewalk over said storage tanks shall be restored to its former condition and shall, at all times during the period of this grant, be maintained by the said grantees.

The pumps to be used in connection with said storage tanks shall be located back of the street line and upon private property, and no permission is hereby given or granted to construct any curb pump within any part of the city street or streets. The said John E. McCrehen, his successors and assigns, shall save the city harmless from any damage that may, in any way, grow out of the construction or maintenance of said tank in said location and shall remove the same and completely restore said sidewalk within ten days after having been directed so to do by resolution adopted by this council.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law provided that the same shall have no force and effect unless prior to the expiration of thirty days after the passage of this ordinance the said John E. McCrehen, his successors and assigns, shall file a written acceptance of the terms and provisions of this ordinance, and shall have paid to the clerk the cost of publication of this ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE No. 37821—To provide for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the improvements herein named.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of Parsons avenue, Broad street to Main street; Thurlow avenue, Cleveland avenue to Dresden avenue; Wall street, State street to Town street; Chapel street, High street to Front street; Fourteenth avenue, Cleveland avenue to Eden avenue; Spring street, Fourth street to Grant avenue, and Warren avenue, south line Heffner Heights addition to Eakin road, by paving and otherwise improving the same, in accordance with ordinance No. 36494, passed July 6, 1925; Nos. 36597, 36598 and 36599, passed August 14, 1925; Nos. 36608 and 36617, passed September 8, 1925; and Nos. 36653 and 36654, passed September 14, 1925, respectively, bonds of said city shall be issued to the amount of \$132,500.
