COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Regular Meeting Mon., March 28, 1927

Council met in regular session with President Wehe in the chair and City Clerk Turner present. Roll call showed all members of council in their places.

Chief Engineer R. H. Simpson reported the estimated assessments for certain improvements: Alley west of Davis avenue, Broad to alley north of State, etc. Placed on file.

Ralph B. Priest, Dan R. S. Sullivan and G. W. Van Gilder, board of revision, reported approval without change of the chief engineer's estimate for certain improvements: Constructing sewer in Central avenue, vacated alley north of B. & O. railroad to Thomas avenue, etc. Placed on file.

Annual reports for 1926 were submitted by the trustees of the sinking fund and the division of fire. Placed on file.

Elnathan Pettit submitted his resignation as legislative clerk in the department of city clerk. Placed on file.

H. Robins and 24 others submitted a protest against the establishing of a junk yard at Washington and Engler. Placed on file.

Nelson R. Benedict and 12 others presented a petition to vacate alley between lots 1 and 4 of H. M. Mauger's subdivision. Service.

Director of Public Service W. H. Duffy submitted report from chief engineer in regard to method of handling financing of assessments. Finance.

McClelland Senff presented a complaint in regard to condition of alley in rear of 1031 Dennison avenue. Service.

Harriet L. Mettle et al. presented a petition for the vacation of Kilbourne street, Vine to C. C. C. & St. L. railroad. Service.

The Salvation Army presented a re-

quest for free water at 138 East State street. Service.

Dr. J. F. Baldwin presented a communication in regard to Franklinton cemetery. Placed on file.

G. S. Kanter presented a request that the widening of Parsons avenue be started at an early date. Placed on file.

R. L. Wirtz presented a protest against the paving of the alley north of Gay street, Wall to Front. Placed on file.

Alfred C. Smith presented a communication favoring the widening of Grant avenue, Broad to Main. Placed on file.

The Builders and Traders exchange presented a communication favoring the passage of an ordinance providing for increased salaries in the division of building regulation. Placed on file.

John E. Brown presented a communication approving the widening of Grant avenue, Broad to Main. Placed on file.

Louis R. Polster presented a request for the paving of Fieser street, Rich to Cherry. Service.

Mrs. Sarah E. Heimberger presented a communication favoring the widening of Grant avenue, Broad to Main. Placed on file.

Director of Public Safety Jno. P. McCune presented a statement from the Allied Architects' association covering expense incurred by trip to Detroit and Toledo for the purpose of inspecting the new police headquarters and safety buildings. Finance.

The Northwest Business Men's association presented a communication in regard to the feeder bus line on Fifth avenue. Placed on file.

By Francis H. Trogus and 12 others, for the paving of Ellsworth avenue, south line of lots 16 to 17 of Evans' subdivision to south line of lot 45 of Spencer's subdivision. Placed on file.

By D. A. Jenkins and four others, for the paving of Dorris avenue, Weber to Pacemont. Placed on file.

By Alfred D. Cole and 15 others, for the paving of the alley north of Ninth street, Worthington, to alley west. Placed on file.

By Albert Shawaker and two others, for the paving of the second alley north of Fifth avenue, Hamlet to Fourth. Placed on file.

Protests Against Improvements

By Viola E. Barbee, against the construction of a sanitary sewer in Thomas avenue, Guilford to alley west. Placed on file.

By Mrs. Walter B. Beebe, against the widening of Grant avenue, Broad to Main. Placed on file.

Ordinances Referred

By Mr. Wehe, No. 37940, to prohibit parking on Jefferson avenue, Spring

to Long, for a period longer than two hours in any one day. Safety.

By Mr. Postle, No. 37951, to authorize the director of public service to enter into a supplementary contract with the Arrow Sand & Gravel company for the dredging and removal of sand and gravel from city land. Service.

By Mr. Postle, No. 37954, to authorize the director of public service to move poles, lines and lamps on High street, Fifth to Dodridge. Service.

By Miss Jones, No. 37955, to provide for an issue of notes in the sum of \$73,000. Finance.

By Mr. Wehe, No. 37956, to prohibit parking on Twentieth street, Spring to Mt. Vernon, for a period longer than two hours in any one day. Safety.

Resolution Referred

By Mr. Worley, that an adjustment in wages to take care of employes who were neglected at the time of reclassification be made. Finance.

Resolutions Lost

By Mr. Worley, to include a provision in the specifications for purchase of new fire apparatus that same shall be equipped with windshields.

By Mr. Worley, to permit the Scott sisters to continue to occupy their home in Weinland park.

ORDINANCES PASSED

AN ORDINANCE No. 37905—To change the name of Arlington avenue.

Whereas, The first street north of Yeoman street, from Cleveland avenue to the alley west of Cleveland avenue, is now called Arlington avenue, and,

Whereas, This is a duplication of street names in that the first street north of Myrtle avenue, from Cleveland avenue to Linden park is also called Arlington avenue, and,

Whereas, The first street north of Myrtle avenue is the original Arlington avenue, and,

Whereas, The first street north of Yeoman street is a direct continuation of Shoemaker avenue and should be changed; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the name of the first street north of Yeoman street, from Cleveland avenue to the alley west of Cleveland avenue, be and it is hereby changed from Arlington avenue to Shoemaker avenue.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
