

Hamilton avenue to the alley west of Velma avenue; in Clinton street, from the alley west of Velma avenue to the alley west of Pontiac avenue; in the alley south of Hudson street (Mock road), from Medina street to the west line of Hiawatha Park Place addition; in Hudson street (Mock road), from Pontiac avenue to Osceola street; in easements and in the alley north of Hudson street (Mock road), from Medina street to Sixth street; in the alleys north of Loretta avenue and Republic avenue, from Medina street to the west line of Highway Park addition, and from the alley west of McGuffey road to the west line of Hahn's subdivision; in the second alley north of Hudson street (Mock road), from the first alley west of Audubon road to the second alley west of Audubon road; in the alleys north of Arcadia avenue, Akola avenue, Indianola drive and Edgar place, from the first alley west of Audubon road to the second alley west of Audubon road; in Briarwood avenue, from the alley west of Grasmere avenue to Atwood terrace; in Akola avenue, from Atwood terrace to the alley west of Atwood terrace; in Genessee avenue, from McGuffey road to the alley west of McGuffey road; in Minnesota avenue, from McGuffey road to Hamilton avenue; in the alleys north of Minnesota avenue and north and south of Manchester avenue, from the alley east of McGuffey road to Hamilton avenue; in Mura place, from Homecroft drive to the alley west of Audubon road; in the alley north of Edgar place, from the east line of Beulah road to Homecroft drive, and in the alley south of Weber road, from McGuffey road to the alley west of Osceola street, in the city of Columbus, Ohio, in accordance with the resolution declaring it necessary to improve the same adopted by council November 29, 1926; and in accordance with the plans, profiles, specifications and estimate of cost therefor approved and now on file in the office of the department of public service.

Sec. 2. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after completion of the proposed improvement, and the city attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Sec. 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, together with interest on bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessment to be levied for said improvement and all other necessary expenditures, less one-fiftieth thereof, shall be assessed in proportion to the special benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: Lots 1 to 9 and lots 11 to 17, inclusive, and reserve E in Kinnear Place addition; the south 174 feet, more or less, of lots 21 and 22 in Highland Cliff addition; reserves A, B, C and D of Indianola Park View No. 4 addition; lots 86 to 90, inclusive, and lots 107 to 127, inclusive, of Indianola Park View No. 3 addition; lots 28 to 35, inclusive, and reserve C of Glen Echo Parcels addition; lots 36 to 41, inclusive, of Glen Echo Parcels No. 2 addition; lots 1 to 97, inclusive, and reserves A, B and C of East Glen Echo addition; lots 1 to 299, inclusive, of Homecroft addition; lots 1 to 702, inclusive, of Almada addition; lots 2 and 3 of Jacob Kiner's Heirs' partition, lots 1 to 318, inclusive, of North Grasmere addition; lots 1 to 41, inclusive, of Hahn's subdivision; lots 5 to 11, inclusive, of Heirs of Casper Kiner's partition; lots 1 to 61, inclusive, of Minnesota Place addition; lots 1 to 72, inclusive, of Harrison Villa addition; lots 681 to 713, inclusive, of Sunnyside addition; lots 1 to 21, inclusive, lots 88 to 135, inclusive, lots 202 to 253, inclusive, and lots 320 to 345, inclusive, of Highway Park addition; reserves A, B, C and lots 1 to 169, inclusive, and lots 178 to 189, inclusive, of Hiawatha Park Place addition; lots 1 to 562, inclusive, of Grasmere Gardens addition; lots 1 to 21, inclusive, and lots 58 to 295, inclusive, of Homestead Heights addition; lots 39 to 69, inclusive, of

Homestead Heights addition No. 2, and parcels of land bounded and described as follows: (a) A parcel of land bounded on the west by the east line of the C. S. & H. railroad right-of-way, on the north by the south line of Weber road, on the east by the west line of Beulah road, and on the south by the north line of East Glen Echo addition. (b) A parcel of land bounded on the west by the east line of Beulah road, on the north by the south line of Weber road, on the east by the west line of Almada addition, and on the south by the north line of Homecroft addition and the north line of Homecroft addition extended easterly to the west line of Almada addition and extended westerly to the east line of Beulah road. (c) A parcel of land bounded on the west by the east line of Audubon road, on the north by the north line of Homecroft addition extended easterly to the west line of Almada addition, on the east by the west line of Almada addition and on the south by the north line of lot 284 of Homecroft addition. (d) A parcel of land bounded on the west by the east line of Homecroft drive, on the north by the south line of the alley north of Hudson street (Mock road), on the east by the west line of lot 1 of Homecroft addition, and on the south by the north line of Hudson street (Mock road). (e) A parcel of land bounded on the west by the east line of Beulah road, on the north by the south line of lot 247 of Homecroft addition, on the east by the west line of the alley west of Homecroft drive and the west line of lot 167 of Homecroft addition, and on the south by the north line of Hudson street (Mock road). (f) A parcel of land bounded on the west by the east line of Beulah road, on the north by the north line of Homecroft addition extended westerly to Beulah road, on the east by the west line of the alley west of Homecroft drive, and on the south by the north line of lot 255 of Homecroft addition. (g) A parcel of land bounded on the west by the east line of McGuffey road, on the north by the south line of Minnesota Place addition, on the east by the west line of Hamilton avenue, and on the south by the north line of lot 11 of Heirs of Casper Kiner's partition. (h) A parcel of land bounded on the west by the east line of McGuffey road, on the north by the south line of Harrison Villa addition, on the east by the west line of Hamilton avenue, and on the south by the north line of Aberdeen avenue. (i) A parcel of land bounded on the west by the east line of Heirs of Casper Kiner's partition, on the north by the south line of lot 109 of Highway Park addition, on the east by the west line of Highway Park addition, and on the south by the north line of Hudson street (Mock road). (j) A piece of acreage owned by Bertha A. Suttles and described as being a piece or parcel of ground out of the north end of a 2½ acre tract of land in quarter township 4, township 1, range 18 of the United States military lands, conveyed by Edgar W. Suttles to Bertha A. Suttles and recorded in deed book 825, page 587, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio; which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement and in an amount to be determined.

Sec. 4. That the sum of \$7,000 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the sewer construction fund to pay the remainder of the cost of said improvement.

Sec. 5. That the assessment so to be levied shall be paid in five annual installments with interest on deferred payments at a rate not exceeding six per cent per annum; provided that the owner of any property assessed may, at his option, pay such assessment or any number of installments thereof, at any time after said assessment has been levied, with interest to the semi-annual interest day of said bonds next following date of payment.

Sec. 6. That bonds of the city of Columbus, Ohio, shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments by installments, and in an amount equal thereto.

Sec. 7. That the director of public service be and is hereby authorized and directed to make and execute contract for said improvement with the lowest and best bidder after advertising according to law.

Sec. 8. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 38070—To authorize the director of public service to enter into a contract to repair portions of the viaduct carrying North High street over the railroad tracks at the Union Depot in the city of Columbus, Ohio, and to employ Clyde T. Morris, an expert engineer, for consultation, inspection, and design services in connection with said repair work, and appropriate the money therefor.

Whereas, An emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of engineering and construction, department of public service, in that the viaduct on North High street at the Union Depot is so badly in need of repair as to endanger life and property in its use, and

Whereas, It is necessary to make, at this time, repairs as will enable the deferral of the repair of the entire structure until further investigation can be made, and

Whereas, The condition of the structure makes necessary special design and treatment, in which Clyde T. Morris is especially qualified; now therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into a contract for furnishing labor and material, and executing such repairs as may be required at this time, such contract to contain a guaranteed maximum cost, and to stipulate that the city shall pay, within such maximum cost, the cost of labor and materials, and compensation for use of all equipment, and a fixed percentage of the cost of all labor and material used in the work to cover overhead, superintendence, and profit, for the repair work which from its nature does not permit the detailing by plans but which shall be done as ordered by the city.

Sec. 2. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to employ Clyde T. Morris as consulting engineer upon this repair work, his services to be compensated for at the rate of \$3 per hour, and to be performed as required by the city, such cost of compensation not to exceed in total amount \$500.

Sec. 3. That from the moneys now in the fund for general purposes, otherwise known as the general fund, and from all moneys estimated to come into said fund, from any and all sources, during the twelve months ending December 31, 1927, if not otherwise appropriated, there be and hereby is appropriated the sum of \$4500, or so much thereof as may be necessary to pay the cost of said work.

Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 38072—To vacate the first alley west of Neil avenue between Oakland avenue and Patterson avenue, as hereinafter fully described. Whereas, on the 14th day of March, 1927, a petition signed by all owners of property abutting upon the first alley west of Neil avenue between Oakland avenue and Patterson avenue, was presented to council consenting to and

praying that said portion of said alley be vacated; and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for and that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the portion of the first alley west of Neil avenue between Oakland avenue and Patterson avenue be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That said city of Columbus hereby reserves to itself and to public utility companies operating in said city the right to operate and maintain any and all public utilities now existing on said portion of said alley and to enter thereon for the purpose of operating, repairing and maintaining the same.

Whereas, On April 20, 1927, at about 10:30 a. m. the Chevrolet touring car of Elmer C. Forbush was damaged by reason of being struck by a train of trailers of the division of refuse collection on McKinley avenue just east of Eureka avenue; and

Whereas, Said Elmer C. Forbush, through no negligence of his own, has suffered damages to his Chevrolet touring car by reason of being struck by said train of trailers in the reasonable sum of \$33.37; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the claim of Elmer C. Forbush in the sum of \$33.37 for damages to his Chevrolet touring car, sustained on April 20, 1927, on McKinley avenue just east of Eureka avenue, as above set forth, be and the same is hereby recognized as a moral obligation of and legal claim against the city of Columbus.

Sec. 2. That for the purpose of paying said claim there be and hereby is appropriated from the general miscellaneous No. 21-H fund the sum of \$33.37.

That the city auditor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the city treasurer in the sum of \$33.37 in payment of said claim upon receipt of voucher approved by the city attorney and a release properly executed by the said Elmer C. Forbush of all damages arising out of said accident.

AN ORDINANCE No. 38075—To authorize payment of the claims of The Columbus Railway, Power & Light company.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Whereas, On or about April 9, 1927, a 55 foot wooden pole of The Columbus Railway, Power & Light company, located on the northeast corner of Broad street and Glenwood avenue, was broken by reason of being struck by a trailer on a train of the division of street cleaning and refuse collection; and

Whereas, Said The Columbus Railway, Power & Light company, through no negligence of its own, has suffered damages by reason of the fact that said pole was broken as above described and that it was necessary that a new pole be put in its place, in the reasonable sum of \$55.80; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the claim of The Columbus Railway, Power & Light company for damages sustained by reason of one of its poles located on the northeast corner of Broad street and Glenwood avenue having been broken on April 9, 1927, as hereinabove set forth, be and the same is hereby recognized as a moral obligation of and legal claim against the city of Columbus.

Sec. 2. That for the purpose of paying said claim there be and hereby is appropriated from the general miscellaneous No. 21-H fund the sum of \$55.80.

Sec. 3. That the city auditor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the city treasurer in the sum of \$55.80 in payment of said claim, upon receipt of voucher approved by the city attorney and a release properly executed by said The Columbus Railway, Power & Light company of all damages arising out of said accident.
