AN ORDINANCE No. 38338—To accept the deed of the board of education of the city school district of Columbus, Ohio, dated July 25, 1927, and dedicating the property therein described to public use for street and alley purposes.

Section 1. AN ORDINANCE No. 38339—To vacate the first alley east of Dennison avenue from the south line of Greenwood avenue to the north line of Fourth avenue, and also to vacate 47.5 feet off the west end of the alley north of Fourth avenue running between the first alley east of Dennison avenue and the first alley west of High street.

Whereas, On the 25th day of July, 1927, a petition by persons owing all of the lots in the immediate vicinity of the lots described in the title hereto, was duly presented to council praying and consenting that said alleys between the points named be vacated; and,

Whereas, Council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. AN ORDINANCE No. 38342—To appropriate an easement in property for the construction and maintenance of a storm drain, including the right to clean, repair and care for the same.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus, (two-thirds of all members elected thereto concurring):

Section 1. That an easement in the following described property be and the same is hereby appropriated for the construction and maintenance of a storm drain, including the right to clean, repair and care for the same, to-wit:

Being a strip of land fifty feet in width, extending from west to east across the lands of Homer Eberly in Marion township, Franklin county, state of Ohio, parcel No. 14, as recorded in deed book No. 657, pages 254-5-6, the center line of which is described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the west boundary line of the land owned by the grantor—Homer Eberly—which point is distant three hundred sixty-four feet northerly from the center line of Livingston avenue, measured at right angles thereto; thence eastwardly on a line parallel to and three hundred sixty-four feet north of the center line of Livingston avenue, two hundred fifty-eight feet, more or less, to a point on the east boundary line of the land owned by the said grantor—Homer Eberly—for the purpose of constructing and maintaining a storm drain, including the right to clean, repair and care for the said drain, together with the right of access to said tract for said purpose.

Sec. 2. That the city attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to apply to a court of competent jurisdiction to have a jury impaneled to make inquiry into and assess the compensation to be paid for said property.

The council of Cleveland in fixing the rate of fare on buses in Cleveland has provided for commutation tickets for school pupils.

AN ORDINANCE No. 38343—To supplement section 820 of the Columbus code of 1919 as amended by ordinance No. 38200, passed June 6, 1927, relating to parking.

Section 1. That section 820 of the Columbus code of 1919 as amended by ordinance No. 38200, passed June 6, 1927, be and the same is hereby supplemented by the addition of paragraph (s) to read as follows:

"There is hereby created a loading or unloading space on the south side of Lynn street, just west of High street, on either side of the shipping entrance of Budd and company, jewelers, located in the room on the southwest corner of West Lynn and North High streets, said loading or unloading space to be equal in length and adjacent to that portion of the building on either side of the shipping entrance which is set back from the street line approximately five feet. The period during which said loading space may be used is between the hours of seven a. m. and six p. m. of the week days."
