

vision to south line of lot 45, Spencer's subdivision, in the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Ellsworth avenue from south line of lots 16 and 17 Evans' subdivision to south line of lot 45 Spencer's subdivision, by grading, draining, curbing, paving the roadway with brick or asphalt, erecting street sign, and laying water main, sanitary sewer, necessary water services and sewer connections, in the city of Columbus, Ohio, in accordance with the resolution declaring it necessary to improve the same adopted by council June 6, 1927; and in accordance with the plans, profiles, specifications and estimate of cost therefor approved and now on file in the office of the department of public service.

Sec. 2. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after completion of the proposed improvement, and the city attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Sec. 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, together with interest on bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessment to be levied for said improvement and all other necessary expenditures, shall be assessed in proportion to the special benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands to-wit: All lots and lands fronting, bounding or abutting upon the proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement and in an amount to be determined.

Sec. 4. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in ten annual installments with interest on deferred payments at a rate not exceeding six per cent per annum; provided that the owner of any property assessed may, at his option, pay such assessment or any number of installments thereof, at any time after said assessment has been levied, with interest to the semi-annual interest day of said bonds next following date of payment.

Sec. 5. That bonds of the city of Columbus, Ohio, shall be issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments by installments, and in an amount equal thereto.

Sec. 6. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to construct said water main by the direct employment of labor and the board of purchase to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the material necessary for constructing said water main.

Sec. 7. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to make and execute contract for the remainder of said improvement with the lowest and best bidder after advertising according to law.

Sec. 8. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 38374 — To prohibit loitering and trespassing upon the public playgrounds of the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Whereas, A number of the public playgrounds of the city of Columbus, Ohio, have been made the congregating places of loafers who meet and create disturbances and disorder after the hours when said playgrounds are closed by the division of public recreation; and

Whereas, The immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health and safety and the preservation of good order in the neighborhood of said playgrounds is necessary and constitutes an emergency; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That any person found trespassing upon any of the public playgrounds of the city of Columbus, or the playgrounds under the city's control, excepting public parks, without a permit therefor from the director of public safety or the director of public recreation, between the hours of nine o'clock p. m. and eight o'clock a. m., shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined for a first offense not less than \$5 nor more than \$25, and for a second or further offense, not less than \$10 nor more than \$50, or imprisoned not less than three nor more than twenty days, or both.

Sec. 2. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 38376 — To dedicate and name a street.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following described strip of land be and it is hereby dedicated to public use for street purposes. Situated in and being a part of lots Nos. 29 and 18 of John Hyers' amended subdivision of record in plat book 1, page 333, Franklin county, Ohio, plat records. RESOLUTIONS

Be it resolved by the council of the city of Columbus:

a. That it is necessary to construct sanitary sewers in Whitehead road from Warren avenue to the alley west of Hague avenue; in Dartmoor road from the alley west of Hague avenue, to the alley west of Binns boulevard; in Whitehead road from the alley west of Binns boulevard to the alley west of Salisbury road; in the alley south of Sullivan avenue from Salisbury road to the alley west of Crescent road; in the alleys west of Salisbury road and Crescent road from the alley south of Sullivan avenue to the south line of Wilshire Heights addition, and in the alleys west of Hague avenue, Wiltshire road, Chestershire road, Roys avenue, and Binns boulevard from Whitehead road to the south line of Wilshire Heights addition in the city of Columbus, Ohio; in accordance with the plans, profiles, specification and estimates of the proposed improvement prepared by the chief engineer, which are hereby approved.

b. That the grade of said sewer shall be as shown on the plans and profiles to-wit: 30 Dr. M of the files of the chief engineer of the department of public service which are, by reference, made a part hereof.
