Section 1. That the first alley south of Capital street from May avenue east to the first alley east of May avenue, formerly known as lot No. 44 in Sessions' addition, be and the same is hereby vacated.

The vacation herein proposed shall become effective, provided the petitioners for said vacation assume and pay an assessment in the sum of \$28.30 levied against said property for the improvement of May avenue and that said petitioners file with the clerk of this council their acceptance in writing of these terms within thirty days from the date of the passage of this ordinance, otherwise said proposed vacation shall be null and void.

**AN ORDINANCE No. 38619**—To vacate a portion of Parker street, a passageway four feet wide off the south side of lot No. 40 of Asa Parker's second subdivision as shown in plat book 3, page 113, Franklin county, Ohio records, and a passageway four feet wide off the south side of 15 feet off the north side of lot No. 33 of Asa Parker's second subdivision, as shown in plat book 3, page 113, Franklin county, Ohio, records.

Whereas, On the 21st day of November, 1927, a petition by a person owning lots in the immediate vicinity of a portion of Parker street and two passageways hereinafter described, each four feet wide, was duly presented to council praying that said portion of said street and said two passageways be vacated; and,

Whereas, There has been filed with council written consent to such vacation by the owner of all of the property abutting the part of Parker street and the two passageways four feet wide, proposed to be vacated; and,

Whereas, Council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for; that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That all that portion of Parker street lying between the south line extended of the new building erected on lots 37, 38 and 39 of Asa Parker's second subdivision, recorded in plat book 3, page 113, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, and the north line extended of the first alley south, said distance being 291.05 feet more or less on the east side and 291.18 feet more or less on the west side, the north boundary of which portion is established by ordinance No. 29384 of the city of Columbus, Ohio, be and the same is hereby vacated.

That the strip of land or passageway four feet wide off the south side of lot No. 40 of Asa Parker's second subdivision as shown in plat book 3, page 113, Franklin county records, deeded by The Columbus-Union Oil Cloth company to the city of Columbus, on March 21, 1925, be and the same is hereby vacated.

That the strip of land or passageway four feet wide off the south side of 15 feet off the north side of lot No. 33 of Asa Parker's second subdivision, as shown in plat book 3, page 113, Franklin county records, deeded by The Columbus Oil Cloth company to the city of Columbus on June 8, 1916, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That said city of Columbus hereby reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers and water lines or any other public utilities, if any, now existing in said portion of said Parker street and said two passageways four feet wide, so vacated and to enter thereon for the

purpose of operating, repairing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**AN ORDINANCE 38620**—To authorize the director of public service to continue the employment of Clyde T. Morris, an expert engineer, for consultation, inspection and design services, in connection with the repair work on the North High street viaduct.

Sec. 2. For the reason stated in the preamble hereto this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force
