AN ORDINANCE No. 39363—To amend sections 1 and 2 of ordinance No. 39345, passed September 17, 1928.

Whereas, council, by ordinance No. 39345, passed September 17, 1928, authorized the issuance of short-time notes in amount of \$123,500, with interest at the rate of four and one-quarter per centum per annum, and

Whereas, bids were received for the sale of these notes on September 24, 1928, and the lowest and best bid received was at the rate of five per centum per annum and the finance committee made the award on that basis, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service in that it is necessary to provide fund without delay for said improvements in order that the same may be completed before the coming of winter; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That sections 1 and 2 of ordinance No. 39345, passed September 17, 1928, be and the same are hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. That for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the levy of special assessments, and in anticipation of the issuance of bonds in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of the following named streets, by installing underground lighting systems, by paving the roadway or otherwise improving the same, in accordance with the legislation heretofore passed by the city council with respect thereto, to pay the property owners' share of the cost and expense of said respective improvements, notes of said city shall be issued in the amount of one hundred twenty-three thousand, five hundred dollars, which shall be placed to the credit of the following funds in the respective amount set opposite same, to-wit:

Provided, however, that the appropriation hereinabove made for installing underground lighting systems, paving the roadway or otherwise improving the streets above listed is subject to the qualification that interest at the rate of five per cent per annum for the period of eighteen months has been included in said respective amounts and the amount necessary to pay said interest is hereby appropriated for the payments thereof and for no other purpose, and the respective amounts above set forth shall be reduced by their proportionate amount for the payment of said interest.

"Sec. 2. Said notes shall be signed by the mayor and auditor, bear date not later than October 1, 1928, and be due and payable April 1, 1930; said notes shall be of the denomination of five thousand dollars each, except note numbered 24 of the denomination of eight thousand five hundred dollars, numbered consecutively from 1 to 24 both inclusive; they shall bear interest at the rate of five per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on first day of

April, 1929; the first day of October, 1929; and the first day of April, 1930; and for which the proper interest coupons bearing a facsimile of the signature of the auditor shall be attached to and made a part of said notes; principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the agency of the city of Columbus, Ohio, in the city of New York."

Sec. 2. That original sections 1 and 2 of ordinance No. 39345, passed September 17, 1928, be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. That, for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 39364—To authorize the director of public service to hire carpenters, teams, motor trucks, air compressors and trenching machines in the division of sewage disposal.

Whereas, it is necessary to hire carpenters, teams, motor trucks, air compressors and trenching machines in connection with construction work in the division of sewage disposal, and,

Whereas, the enlargement of the main sewage pumping station is being carried out under an order from the state health department, must be completed in the shortest possible time, and is therefore an emergency measure for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he hereby is authorized to hire the necessary carpenters, teams, motor trucks, air compressors and trenching machines to be used in connection with construction work in the division of sewage disposal at rates per hour: not to exceed the following: For carpenter, \$1.22½ per hour; for teams, \$0.90 per hour; for motor trucks, 1 to 2 tons capacity, \$1.50 per hour; 3 to 4 tons capacity, \$2.50 per hour; more than 4 tons capacity, \$3 per hour; for air compressors, \$10 per day; for trenching machines, \$5 per hour.

Sec. 2. That for the reason stated in the preamble hereto this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 39365—Authorizing and directing the board of purchase to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the purchase of one coupe automobile for use in the division of street maintenance and repair.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of street maintenance and repair, in that transportation is immediately necessary for one of the foremen; now, therefore,

AN ORDINANCE No. 39366—To vacate a portion of Naghten street at the intersection of Gorman street.

Whereas, a petition by the owners of property abutting the southwest corner of the intersection of Naghten street and Gorman street was duly presented to council, praying that a portion of Naghten street at the above-named location, be vacated, and

Whereas, council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for, and that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following described portion of Naghten street, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the east line of Gorman street (formerly Lowe alley) where the original south line of North Public lane, now Naghten street, intersects the same; said beginning point being the northwest corner of original inlet No. 30; thence eastwardly following the north line of said inlet No. 30 to its intersection with the south line of said North Public lane (now Naghten street); thence westwardly with the present south line of Naghten street to a point where the east line of Gorman street (formerly Lowe alley) extended northwardly from the northwest corner of inlet No. 30 would intersect the same; thence southwardly with the east line of Gorman street (Lowe alley) to the northwest corner of inlet No. 30 and place of beginning, be and the same is hereby vacated.

AN ORDINANCE No. 39368—Authorizing the director of public service to enter into a modification of the contract to correct the acoustics of the council chamber of the new city hall building so as to include certain rooms therein named.

Whereas, by ordinance No. 39305, passed August 6, 1928, the director of public service was authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into a contract to correct the acoustics in the council chamber of the city hall building; and,

Whereas, the sum of \$2000 was appropriated for said purpose, which appropriation was sufficient to give like treatment to certain other rooms of the city hall building and the authorization therefor was omitted from said ordinance by inadvertence; and,

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service in that it is necessary to complete said work immediately before the contractor's equipment is removed; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a modification of the contract with The Johns Manville corporation to correct the acoustics in the office of the city attorney and the public lobby and stenographers' room of the city attorney's office, and in the large conference room opposite the mayor's office, the prices to be paid therefor being the same unit prices as submitted by said successful bidder for the council chamber.

Sec. 2. That said work shall be paid for from the appropriation made by said ordinance No. 39305.
