AN ORDINANCE No. 399-55—To authorize and direct the board of purchase to purchase from the Rockwell Manufacturing Company of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, without advertising for bids, certain gas metering and regulating devices for use at the sewage treatment works, and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, in connection with the current program of extending and improving the sewage treatment works, certain gas metering and regulating devices are required to modify and extend the existing gas distribution and control system; and,

Whereas, the Rockwell Manufacturing Company of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, the manufacturer of the existing gas metering and regulating devices and equipment, is the sole source of replacement parts therefor; and,

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the sub-division of sewage treatment, division of sewerage and drainage, department of public service, in that provision for obtaining the said gas metering and regulating devices for installation along with and without delay to the construction now under way at the sewage treatment works, is needed for the immediate preservation of public health, property, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to purchase from the Rockwell Manufacturing Company of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, without advertising for bids, one valve plate assembly for No. 4 EMCO sewage gas meter, one No. 5 EMCO sewage gas meter, one EMCO natural gas pressure regulator, eight horizontal indexes for No. 4 EMCO sewage gas meter, and six vertical indexes for No. 4 1/2 EMCO sewage gas meter.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$1,400, or so much thereof as may be needed, be and it is hereby appropriated from sewage treatment works fund No. 6 to pay the cost thereof.

AN ORDINANCE No. 402-55—To authorize a modification of contract No. 3828 with Altman-Coady company, contractor for furnishing and erect-

ing prefabricated steel building at city material yard.

Whereas, it was necessary to extend the finished area of the repair shop nine feet four inches to the west and to furnish molded type rubber weatherstripping on the bottom rails of two overhead doors, and

Whereas, no provision was made in said contract for the payment of such extra work, and

Whereas, the contractor has furnished the molded type rubber weatherstripping on the bottom rails of two overhead doors, and has extended the finished area of the repair shop nine feet four inches, and has agreed to accept payment therefor for the sums of \$30 and \$481.25, respectively, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of engineering and construction, in that additional monies should be made immediately available in order to pay the contractor the final estimate now due for the work performed, thereby protecting the city's credit; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a modification of contract No. 3828, dated October 13, 1954, with Altman-Coady company, for the furnishing and erecting of prefabricated steel building at city material yard, to provide for the furnishing of the molded type rubber weatherstripping on the bottom rails of two overhead doors at \$30.00, and for extending the finished area of the repair shop nine feet four inches at \$481.25, totaling \$511.25.

Sec. 2. That the city auditor be and he is hereby authorized to certify the additional sum of \$511.25, from the monies originally appropriated from the maintenance and repair No. 65-602 fund, by certificate No. 4163, to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owner of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley west of Bancroft street, Bancroft street, alley west of Joyce avenue and alley south of 25th avenue was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said street and alleys, between the specified limits, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley west of Bancroft street, Bancroft street and the

alley west of Joyce avenue, extending from the north line of the alley south of 25th avenue, to the south line of 25th avenue; and the alley south of 25th avenue, extending from the east line of the alley west of Joyce avenue to the west line of the alley west of Bancroft street, be and the same are hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said street and alleys hereby vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of constructing, installing, replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

AN ORDINANCE No. 404-55—An emergency ordinance giving consent of the City of Columbus, Ohio, to the Franklin County Commissioners, Franklin County, Ohio, to make the following described improvement and to immediately proceed with the preparation of plans, specifications, drawing, profiles or estimates required for the construction of the Goodale Street leg of the expressway and freeway system to be built in the City of Columbus, Franklin County, Ohio; and upon completion of said plans, specifications, etc., and the approval thereof by the proper City, County, State and Federal authorities and the determination by said authorities to proceed with the construction of said Goodale Street project, to then agree upon, assume and pay that portion of the actual cost of said project as may properly belong to the City of Columbus.

Whereas, the Council of the City of Columbus as provided in Ordinance No. 13-55, has proposed and entered into a cooperation agreement with the Director of Highways of the State of Ohio pursuant to Section 5521.01, Ohio Revised Code, for the construction of a certain expressway and freeway project more fully described as follows: being that part of the Interbelt Freeway extending from approximately the Chesapeake & Ohio Railroad structures over the Olentangy River Boulevard and over Goodale Street extending easterly to the right-of-way of the New York Central Railroad, east of Fourth Street including the interchanges at the Olentangy River Road, Neil Avenue, Third Street and connections to Fourth Street. The limits of the section are further indicated and shown on Figure 5, Pages 40 and 41 and also described as priority No. 3, Page 80 in an engineering report designated "Expressway System, Columbus, Ohio, Urban Area, February 1952", hereinafter referred to as report prepared by Howard, Needles, Tammen and Bergendoff, consulting engineers, or as such report may be altered by mutual consent as a result of further investigation.

Whereas, it is now the determination of this Council that the necessary plans, specifications, etc., be prepared without delay for the above described Goodale Street leg of the expressway and freeway within the City of Columbus, County of Franklin, State of Ohio; and,

Whereas, an emergency exists in that in order to obtain approvals of the various political subdivisions concerned in said expressway and

freeway project, it is necessary without delay to have the necessary plans, specifications, etc., prepared, and for the immediate preservation of the public property, peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That it is declared to be in the public interest that the consent of the City of Columbus, Ohio, be given, and such consent is hereby given, to the Franklin County Commissioners, Franklin County, Ohio, to make the following described improvement and to immediately proceed with the preparation of plans, specifications, drawings, profiles or estimates required for the construction of the Goodale Street leg of the Expressway and Freeway System to be built in the City of Columbus, Franklin County, Ohio, which expressway and freeway project is more fully described as follows:

"being that part of the Interbelt Freeway extending from approximately the Chesapeake & Ohio Railroad structures over the Olentangy River Boulevard and over Goodale Street extending easterly to the right-of-way of the New York Central Railroad, east of Fourth Street including the interchanges at the Olentangy River Road, Neil Avenue, Third Street and connections to Fourth Street. The limits of the section are further indicated and shown on Figure 5, Pages 40 and 41 and also described as priority No. 3, Page 80 in an engineering report designated 'Expressway System, Columbus, Ohio, Urban Area, February 1952', hereinafter referred to as report prepared by Howard, Needles, Tammen and Bergendoff, consulting engineers, or as such report may be altered by mutual consent as a result of further investigation."

Sec. 2. That the City of Columbus, Ohio, upon the completion of said plans, specifications, etc., for the expressway and freeway project described in Section 1 above, and the approval thereof by the proper City, County, State and Federal authorities and the determination by said authorities to proceed with the construction of said expressway and freeway project, to then agree upon, assume and pay that portion of the actual cost of said expressway and freeway project as may properly belong to the City of Columbus, Ohio. That the consent of the City of Columbus as herein given to the Franklin County Commissioners, Franklin County, Ohio, concerning the expressway and freeway project as set forth in Sections 1 and 2 above, is based upon the authority granted to political subdivisions under such circumstances, in Chapters 5521 and 5557, Ohio Revised Code.

Sec. 3. That the Clerk of Council be and she is hereby directed to furnish the Franklin County Commissioners, Franklin County, Ohio, with a certified copy of this ordinance immediately upon the taking effect thereof and upon acceptance and approval of said ordinance by the Franklin County Commissioners it shall, subject always to the conditions specified herein, become a binding agreement between the City of Columbus, Ohio and the Franklin County Commissioners, Franklin County, Ohio.

Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor, otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 407-55—To authorize and direct the Director of Public Service to enter into a Modification of Contract No. 3932, by and between the City of Columbus, Ohio, and the Harris-McBurney Co., 1006 Airport Road, Jackson, Michigan, for the improvements and development of the Columbus Municipal Airport, Port Columbus, as hereinafter set forth, and to appropriate the money to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, pursuant to the authority granted in Ordinance No. 1660-54 passed December 13, 1954, Contract No. 3932 was executed by and between the City of Columbus, Ohio and the Harris-McBurney Company, Jackson, Michigan; and

Whereas, during construction under and pursuant to Contract No. 3932 it has been determined immediately necessary by the City of Columbus and the
