AN ORDINANCE No. 414-46—To authorize payment of the claim of V. M. Henry, 449 Piedmont Road, Columbus, Ohio.

Whereas, on June 1, 1946, at approximately 10:00 p.m., Mr. Henry was driving his 1939 Plymouth sedan north on North Fourth street when his car struck an up-turned manhole cover located at East Spring street thereby causing damage to the grill and to the pan under the grill, in the sum of \$35.

Whereas, the said Mr. Henry, through no fault of his own, has suffered damages to his car in the reasonable sum of \$35; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the claim of V. M. Henry, in the sum of \$35, for damages to his automobile sustained on June 1, 1946, as hereinabove set forth, be and the same is hereby recognized as a moral claim against the city of Columbus.

Sec. 2. That for the purpose of paying said claim, there be and hereby is appropriated from the general miscellaneous, No. 21-H fund, the sum of \$35.

Sec. 3. That the city auditor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the city treasurer in the sum of \$35 in payment of said claim, upon receipt of voucher approved by the city attorney and a release properly executed by the said V. M. Henry of all damages arising out of said accident.

AN ORDINANCE No. 416-46—To dedicate premises owned by the city of Columbus to public use for alley purposes.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following described premises, acquired by the city of Columbus on July 25, 1946, by appropriation, in the case of city of Columbus vs Mary Morgan, et al., No. 167342, Common Pleas Court, Franklin County, Ohio, to-wit:

PARCEL 1:

Situated in the county of Franklin, in the state of Ohio, and the city of Columbus, and being in the north portion of lot No. 134, Walhalla Park Place subdivision, as recorded in plat book 9, page 16, Franklin county recorder's office, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the northwest corner of lot No. 134, Walhalla Park Place subdivision; thence southeasterly on a straight line extending from the northwest corner of said lot No. 134 to a point in the south line of said lot No. 134 and the north line of Gudrun road, said point being located at a distance of 10 feet westward from the southeast corner of said lot No. 134, a distance of 106.6 feet, more or less, to a point in the south line of the north portion of said lot No. 134, owned by Emma J. Worstell; thence westwardly with the said south line of the north portion of said lot No. 134 a distance of 20.1 feet, more or less, to a point in said line; thence northwestwardly on a

straight line parallel to the first described line and 20 feet distant therefrom, measured at right angles, a distance of 33.7 feet, more or less, to a point in the west line of said lot No. 134; thence with the west line of said lot No. 134 a distance of 77.3 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning.

PARCEL 2:

Situated in the county of Franklin, in the state of Ohio, and the city of Columbus and being in the south portion of lot No. 134, Walhalla Park Place subdivision, as recorded in plat book 9, page 16, Franklin county recorder's office, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the north line of Gudrun Road and the south line of lot No. 134, said point being located at a distance of 10 feet westward from the southeast corner of lot No. 134, Walhalla Park Place subdivision; thence northeastwardly on a straight line extending from the first described point to the northwest corner of said lot No. 134, a distance of 68.25 feet, more or less, to a point in the north line of the south portion of said lot No. 134, owned by Frank P. and Mary S. Morgan; thence westwardly with the said north line of said south portion of lot No. 134, a distance of 20.1 feet, more or less, to a point in said line; thence southwardly on a straight line parallel to the first described line and 20 feet distant therefrom, measured at right angles, a distance of 72.0 feet, more or less, to a point in the south line of said lot No. 134 and the north line of Gudrun Road; thence eastwardly with said south line of lot No. 134 and the north line of Gudrun Road a distance of 20.75 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning.

Situated in the county of Franklin, state of Ohio, and in the city of Columbus and being a portion of the second alley west of Midgard road, vacated, between Gudrun road and the north line extended of lot No. 104, Walhalla Park Place subdivision, as recorded in plat book 9, page 16, Franklin county recorder's office, and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the point of intersection of the east line of the second alley west of Midgard Road, vacated, and the north line of lot No. 104 extended; thence southwestwardly with the said east line of said alley, vacated, a distance of 56.3 feet, more or less, to a point in said east line; thence northwestwardly on a straight line parallel to the east line of a proposed alley (said east line extending from the northwest corner of said lot No. 134 to a point 10 feet westward from the southeast corner of said lot No. 134 measured along the south line of said lot) and 20 feet distant therefrom measured at right angles, a distance of 54.7 feet, more or less, to the north line of said lot No. 104 extended; thence eastwardly with said north line, extended, to the place of beginning, be and the same are hereby dedicated to public use for alley purposes.

AN ORDINANCE No. 417-46—To grant Don M. Casto the right and privilege to cause the improvement of Broadmoor avenue, from Mayfair boulevard to Hampton road.

Whereas, Don M. Casto has requested the privilege of improving Broadmoor avenue, from Mayfair boulevard to Hampton road, at his own cost and expense; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That Don M. Casto be and he is hereby granted permission to cause the improvement of Broadmoor avenue, from Mayfair boulevard to Hampton road, at his own cost and expense, by grading, draining, curbing, installing fire hydrants and water services, in accordance with the plans and specifications marked 1267, drawer D, on file in the office of the director of public service, which are hereby approved, subject to the following terms and conditions:

Said Don M. Casto shall pay the entire cost of such improvement, shall save the city free and harmless from any and all claims for damages and shall defend any and all suits which may be brought against the city of Columbus by reason of such improvement, and shall deposit with the city treasurer through the office of the city engineer the sum of \$745 to cover the cost of inspection, installation of fire hydrants and water services.

Sec. 2. That the grade of said street shall be established as of record in profile book 12, page 95, on file in the office of the chief engineer.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, provided, however, that Don M. Casto shall agree to the terms and conditions hereof, in writing, deposit the amount of money herein stipulated, and pay the cost of publication hereof, otherwise this ordinance shall be without force and effect.

AN ORDINANCE No. 419-46—To authorize the director of public service to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the construction of relief, sanitary and storm sewers, fund No. 2, contract No. 2, storm relief sewer, Logan street, etc. and Guilford avenue, etc., and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, council by ordinance No. 20-46, passed January 14, 1946, established the relief, sanitary and storm sewers, fund No. 2, as authorized by
