

Code of 1930, by enacting new section 905-1.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That chapter XIV — licenses — subdivision 15 — peddlers — of the Columbus Code of 1930, be and the same is hereby supplemented by enacting new section 905-1.

Sec. 905-1. CONVERSION OF LICENSE. The city auditor may issue a license in any classification higher than the original license purchased, except a veteran's license, upon surrender of such license certificate and plate or badge and the payment of a fee equal to the difference in the cost of such license, the cost of such former license being thereby credited to the cost of such new license but no refund shall be allowed. Licenses submitted for conversion shall be destroyed immediately by the city auditor.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 450-40—To amend section 910 of the Columbus Code of 1930 as amended by ordinance No. 434-34, passed November 26, 1934, and to repeal such section 905 as so amended.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That section 910 of the Columbus Code of 1930 as amended by ordinance No. 434-34, passed November 26, 1934, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 910. EXEMPTIONS. The foregoing sections shall not apply to persons selling by sample only where no deposit or down payment is required, nor to the products of his or her own hands so long as such products do not consist of foodstuffs or other products for human consumption, nor to the sale of goods imported from other states or foreign countries and sold in unbroken packages, nor to the sale of agricultural products offered or exposed for sale by the producer, nor to sales made at the places provided in and under the provisions of chapter VIII, subdivision 7—markets—sections 684 to 712, inclusive, of the Columbus Code of 1930. Provided, however, that all persons, firms or corporations engaged in the business of peddling and claiming exemption hereunder shall first register the name and address of all such persons and agents so engaged with the city auditor and shall furnish an affidavit in support of such claim of exemption together with a fee of one dollar for the calendar year of such registration. The auditor shall issue to such person a registration plate if a conveyance is to be used in peddling, and a certificate of registration with a descriptive term "Registered producer". Such plate shall be displayed plainly on the outer left side of all vehicles or devices used and the certificate or registration shall be in the possession of such registrant and shall be exhibited for inspection to any officer authorized by law upon his demand.

Sec. 2. That said section 910 of the Columbus Code of 1930 as amended by ordinance No. 434-34, passed November 26, 1934, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 451-40—To authorize the director of public service to advertise for bids and enter into contract for the removal of the top of the tower at No. 1 engine house, Front and Elm streets.

Whereas: an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service in that it is immediately necessary to contract for the removal of the top of the tower at No. 1 engine house, for the immediate preservation of public health, and safety, now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into contract for the removal of the top of the tower at No. 1 engine house, as per specifications on file in the office of the director of public service, all of which is hereby approved.

Section 2. That the sum of \$1,600 or so much thereof as may be needed, be and the same is hereby appropriated from division of fire No. 37, 201 fund to pay the contract cost.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance for the reason stated in the preamble hereto, is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 452-40—To authorize payment of the claim of J. E. Cummings, 1539 E. Weber Road.

Whereas, on or about September 23, 1940, at about 7:30 p. m., the 1940 Ford coupe of J. E. Cummings was damaged when it was run into by a city fire department ladder wagon while said automobile was parked at the curb on North Fourth street near Eleventh avenue;

Whereas, said J. E. Cummings, through no negligence of his own, has suffered damage to his Ford automobile by reason of the aforesaid accident in the reasonable sum of \$37.58; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the claim of J. E. Cummings in the sum of \$37.58 for damage to his Ford coupe sustained on or about September 23, 1940, as hereinabove set forth, be and the same is hereby recognized as a moral obligation of the city of Columbus.

Sec. 2. That for the purpose of paying said claim, there be and hereby is appropriated from general miscellaneous, No. 21-H fund, the sum of \$37.58.

Sec. 3. That the city auditor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the city treasurer in the sum of \$37.58, in payment of said claim, upon receipt of voucher approved by the city attorney and a release properly executed by said J. E. Cummings of all damages arising out of said accident.

Sec. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 455-40—To vacate certain portions of the alley west of Neil avenue (Haynes alley).

AN ORDINANCE NO. 457-40—To authorize the board of purchase to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the purchase of two material spreaders, and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of street sprinkling and cleaning, in that the purchase of two material spreaders are immediately needed for the purpose of spreading rock salt on the streets and alleys of the city of Columbus in connection with the removal of snow and ice, thereby protecting the public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the purchase of two material spreaders for use in the division of street sprinkling and cleaning in connection with the removal of snow and ice from the city streets and alleys.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$550, or so much thereof as may be needed, be and it is hereby appropriated from the street sprinkling and cleaning No. 91-700 fund to pay the cost thereof.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 458-40—To authorize the director of public service and the mayor of the city of Columbus, Ohio to execute a deed of easement to the state of Ohio for city owned property for highway purposes.

Whereas, the department of highways, state of Ohio is causing the improvement of state highway No. 558, section B (Pt), and

Whereas, such improvement demands the acquisition of certain city owned property, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in that the deeding of such property is immediately necessary in order that the work involved not be delayed and to protect the public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service and the mayor of the city of Columbus, Ohio be and they are hereby authorized and directed to execute a deed of easement to the state of Ohio in, upon and over the city owned property along the west right-of-way line of state highway No. 558 and extending from a point where Lake road intersects said state highway No. 558 to a point where Stanberry road intersects said highway, for the purpose of improving said state highway, more particularly described as follows:
