

AN ORDINANCE No. 458-41—To vacate a portion of Yoeman street between Fields avenue and Ohlen avenue and a portion of the intersection of Yoeman street and Ohlen avenue.

Whereas, a petition signed by the owner of all the lots and lands abutting upon Yoeman street from the west line of lot No. 135 of Samuel Doyle's Lockwin addition to the east line of lot No. 129 of said addition was duly presented to the council of the city of Columbus, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said street, between the limits named, and

Whereas, council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for and that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That Yoeman street, between the west line of lot No. 135 and the east line of lot No. 129 of Samuel Doyle's Lockwin addition and a portion of the intersection of Yoeman street and Ohlen avenue, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the north line of Yoeman street, said point being the extension of a line between lots 135 and 136, Samuel Doyle's Lockwin addition; thence with the north line of Yoeman street eastwardly to the southeast corner of lot No. 8 of the subdivision of Ohlen estate; thence northeastwardly 115.7 feet, more or less, to a point in the east line of said lot No. 8 and the west line of Ohlen avenue; thence southwardly with the west line of Ohlen avenue extended 33 feet to a point; thence southeastwardly on a line parallel to the east line of Ohlen avenue and 50 feet distant therefrom, 103 feet, more or less, to a point where the west line of Ohlen avenue extended from the south would intersect; thence southwardly with the extension of the west line of Ohlen avenue 32 feet, more or less, to the south line of Yoeman street; thence westwardly with said south line of Yoeman street to the line between lots 135 and 136, Samuel Doyle's Lockwin addition; thence northwardly with the extension of said line to the place of beginning,

be and the same are hereby vacated, subject to the following conditions:

The owner of the abutting property shall, by warranty deed, convey to the city of Columbus, Ohio, a strip of land as hereinafter described, said land so deeded to be dedicated to public use for street purposes and to be known as Timken street:

A strip of ground 30 feet in width off the north side of lots 1 to 8, inclusive, of the subdivision of the Ohlen estate for street purposes.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus hereby reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers and water lines or any other public utilities owned by said city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any and all other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said street so to be vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of operating, replacing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, upon the filing with the clerk of this council of a warranty deed covering the conveyance of the hereinabove described property and the payment of the cost of publication hereof.

AN ORDINANCE No. 459-41—To vacate the alley north of Fifth avenue (English alley), from the east line of the alley west of Ohlen avenue (Welch alley) to the east line of lot No. 111 of Samuel Doyle's Lockwin addition.

Whereas, a petition signed by the owner of all the lots and lands abutting upon the alley north of Fifth

avenue (English alley), from the east line of the alley west of Ohlen avenue (Welch alley) to the east line of lot No. 111 of Samuel Doyle's Lockwin addition, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points named, and

Whereas, council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for and that it will not be detrimental to the interests of the general public and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley north of Fifth avenue (English alley), from the east line of the alley west of Ohlen avenue (Welch alley) to the east line of lot No. 111 of Samuel Doyle's Lockwin addition, be and the same is hereby vacated, subject to the following conditions:

(a) The owner of the abutting properties shall, by warranty deed, convey to the city of Columbus a strip of land 10 feet in width, as hereinafter described, and said land so deeded shall be dedicated to public use for alley purposes:

A 10 foot strip of ground off the south side of lots Nos. 129 and 130 of Samuel Doyle's Lockwin Addition for alley purposes.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus hereby reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers and water lines or any other public utilities owned by said city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any and all other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley so to be vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of operating, replacing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, upon the filing with the clerk of this council of a warranty deed covering the conveyance of the hereinabove described property and the payment of the cost of publication hereof.

AN ORDINANCE No. 462-41—To appropriate additional funds and to pay the cost of fuel gas service to be furnished to the department of public service, division of sewage treatment by the Ohio Fuel Gas company as per contract No. 59, from August 1, 1941, to December 31, 1941.

Whereas, by ordinance No. 431-40, passed October 14, 1940, and amended by ordinance 505-40, passed November 25, 1940, council authorized the director of public service to enter into a contract with the Ohio Fuel Gas company to install a service line and furnish fuel gas to the division of sewage treatment, under provisions of industrial rate No. 2, and appropriated funds to pay the cost thereof; and

Whereas, pursuant to aforesaid ordinances, a contract was entered into by the director of public service with the Ohio Fuel Gas company, December 26, 1940; and

Whereas, the funds appropriated by aforesaid ordinances are insufficient for fuel gas service for the year ending December 31, 1941, therefore, now

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the sum of five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be needed, be and it is hereby appropriated from sewage treatment fund No. 71-010-B-2 for the purchase of fuel gas for the remainder of the year ending December 31, 1941, pursuant to the terms and conditions of said contract.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 463-41—To limit the parking of vehicles on the north side of Fulton street, between Zettler street and Fieser street.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the parking of vehicles on the north side of Fulton street between Zettler street and Fieser street, between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., be and the same is hereby prohibited for a period longer than two hours in any one square or in the same square within the following hour, provided said restrictions shall not apply on Sundays and holidays.

Sec. 2. That for the violation of this ordinance, the penalty as fixed in the official traffic code shall apply and be in force.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
