COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

Reg. Meeting, Monday, Feb. 15, 1937
(No. 7)

Council met in regular session with President Karns in the chair. Roll call showed five members present.

Myron B. Gessaman, mayor, submitted budget for the year 1937. Placed on file.

Glenn Summerland submitted claim for damage to automobile. Judiciary.

John L. Davies, city attorney, submitted report in connection with claim of Edna McCollister and Donald McCollister for damage to automobile. Judiciary.

The Columbus Prison Association submitted request for an appropriation for song books to be used at the city prison and workhouse. Finance.

Frank Pink submitted claim for damage to automobile. Judiciary.

Harry G. Fitzgerald, Jr., submitted a communication asking for reduction in assessment against certain lots on East Mound street. Judiciary.

F. D. Heigel submitted a communication, protesting the parking of trucks in the alley between Front and Water streets so that they block Gay street. Safety.

Mrs. Rauch submitted a communication, complaining against the parking of a coal truck in front of her residence. Safety.

A. W. Livingston, president of the Retail Merchants association, submitted a communication relative to expiration of lease June 30, 1937, between the city of Columbus and the U. S. Army Air corps, covering occupation of the municipal hangar and operating rights at Port Columbus. Airport committee.

Peter Patterson submitted claim for damage to automobile. Judiciary.

The South Side Civic and Industrial association submitted a communication, relative to the needs of a bridge over the railroads at Front street, Whittier or Kossuth streets. Service.

The following annual reports for the year 1936 were submitted: public defender, division of workhouse, municipal court, city treasurer. Placed on file.

Ordinances Referred

By Mr. Addison, No. 47-37, to prohibit the construction or erection of tents within the city of Columbus except for temporary purposes. Safety.

By Mr. Dailey, No. 48-37, to ratify and approve the payment of one extra deputy clerk of the municipal court from the first day of January, 1937, to the 25th day of January, 1937, and recognize said payment as a moral and legal obligation against the city of Columbus. Finance.

By Mr. Millikin, No. 53-37, to create an account for the division of electricity, department of public service, city of Columbus, Ohio, which shall be known as depreciation fund, division of electricity. Finance.

No. 54-37, to provide funds for the operation, maintenance, management, repair, enlargement and replacement of the sewerage system, regulator chambers, storm stand-by tanks, pumping stations and sewage treatment works of the city of Columbus, Ohio, etc. Service.

Ordinance Lost

By Mr. Millikin, No. 57-37, to change the zoning of the property known as lots 91 and 92 of St. Mary's Gate addition, located on the west side of Sunbury Road and the N. Y. C. R. R.

ORDINANCES

AN ORDINANCE NO. 49-37—To name the first street west of and parallel of the C. & O. tracks connecting King avenue and Chambers road.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the first street west of and parallel of the C. & O. tracks, connecting King avenue and Chambers road, be and it is hereby named Necco street.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 50-37—To authorize the director of public service to enter into agreements with the works progress administration for the improvement of Pearl street, Glencoe

road to Arden road, and the alley north of Tibet road, East avenue to Calumet street, and to establish the grades thereof.

Whereas, the works progress administration has proposed to cooperate with the city in the improvement of Pearl street, Glencoe road to Arden road, and the alley north of Tibet road, East avenue to Calumet street, and

Whereas, it is necessary that the director of public service enter into agreements with said W. P. A. officials covering said improvements, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in that the grades of said streets between the said points should be established prior to the improvements thereof; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into agreements with the works progress administration covering the improvements of Pearl street, Glencoe road to Arden road, and the alley north of Tibet road, East avenue to Calumet street, as W. P. A. projects.

Sec. 2. That the grade of Pearl street, between the points designated, be and it is hereby established as shown in profile book 18, page 6; and the grade of the alley north of Tibet road, between the points designated, as shown in profile book 12, page 12, and profile book 11, page 107, on file in the office of the chief engineer.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 51-37—To authorize the director of public service to advertise for bids and to enter into a contract for the construction of relief, sanitary and storm sewers, contract No. 15, Walhalla Ravine relief sewer, and to appropriate the money therefor.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service in that it is immediately necessary to contract for the construction of relief, sanitary and storm sewers, contract No. 15, Walhalla Ravine relief sewer, in order that the same may be done in conformity with the national industrial recovery act, public works administration, and for the immediate preservation of public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and to enter into a contract for the construction of relief, sanitary and storm sewers, contract No. 15, Walhalla Ravine relief sewer, extending from Walhalla road and Tulanna road west from Sunset drive to Indianola avenue, in accordance with contract documents and estimate cost thereof on file in the department of public service, all of which are hereby approved.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$55,000, or so much thereof as may be needed, be and the same is hereby appropriated from relief, sanitary and storm sewers fund No. 1, P. W. A. docket 1931.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance for the
