

AN ORDINANCE No. 487-55—To authorize the Board of Purchase to enter into a modification of Contract No. 3997 between the City of Columbus and James B. Clow and Sons for furnishing cast iron pipe and fittings to the Division of Water, Department of Public Service.

Whereas, pursuant to Ordinance 218-55, passed February 14, 1955, the Board of Purchase entered into Contract No. 3997 with James B. Clow and Sons, and

Whereas, due to a modification of specifications for sidewalk space in twenty-one new streets by the City Engineering Department, it is necessary to modify the James B. Clow contract with regard to hydrant tees.

Whereas, Item five in this contract called for Standard Cast Iron Hydrant Tees and due to changes in plans it is necessary for a portion of this item to be Lucas County Tees in order to eliminate excessive cost of installing the hydrant connections and back-filling with gravel grits, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Water, Department of Public Service, in that it is immediately necessary to enter into a modification of contract No. 3997 with James B. Clow and Sons in order that the proper fittings may be supplied to reduce excessive installation costs for installing hydrant tees on new streets now in the process of being improved for the immediate preservation of public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Board of Purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a modification of Contract No. 3997 with James B. Clow and Sons, said modification to provide the following:

Furnish 75—8" x 8" x 6" Lucas County Tees in place of 8" x 8" x 6" Cast Iron Hydrant Tees, Class D, as specified in Item 5 on Page 4 of the above contract.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$375.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated to Contract No. 3997 from Water Works Fund No. 90, Code 602, to cover the cost of the above modification.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 489-55—To authorize the Board of Purchase to advertise for bids and enter into a contract for the purchase of a new Air Compressor and Pneumatic Tools and to trade in one used air compressor, as part of the purchase price, for the Division of Water, Department of Public Service, and to appropriate the funds therefor.

Whereas, the Water Works Shop now has an air compressor which is fifteen years old and they are unable to obtain repair parts for this unit, and

Whereas, it is necessary that each main line and tapping crew operating from the Water Works Shop be equipped with an air compressor and complete set of pneumatic tools, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Water, Department of Public Service, in that it is immediately necessary to purchase an air compressor and set of pneumatic tools to provide the proper equipment for main line and tapping crews in order that the installation of main lines and repairs to existing lines and services may continue uninterrupted for the immediate preservation of public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Board of Purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into a contract for the purchase of the following equipment:

- 1—Air Compressor
- 1—Buster
- 1—Tampor
- 1—Spade
- 1—Sump Pump

in accordance with specifications on file in the office of the Board of Purchase and to trade in as part of the purchase price one used air compressor for the Division of Water, Department of Public Service.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$4,500, or as much thereof as may be needed, be and the same is hereby appropriated from Water Works Fund No. 90, Code 700, to pay the cost thereof.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 490-55—To authorize and direct the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into contracts for the purchase of fuel oil, chemical lime, ferric chloride, filter cloths, and lubricating oil, for use at the sewage treatment works during the twelve months period ending June 30, 1956, and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into contracts for the purchase of the following supplies, in accordance with specifications on file in the office of the board of purchase, for use at the sewage treatment works, division of sewerage and drainage, department of public service, during the twelve months period ending June 30, 1956: approximately 400,000 gallons of fuel oil, approximately 1,300 tons of chemical lime, approximately 300 tons of ferric chloride, approximately 75 filter cloths, and approximately 8,000 gallons of lubricating oil.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$95,000, or so much thereof as may be needed be and it is hereby appropriated from sewerage fund No. 71-010 B-A to pay the cost thereof.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 491-55—To authorize the Board of Purchase to advertise for bids and enter into contract for coal for the Division of Garbage Disposal and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, coal is necessary to assist in the burning of garbage, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Garbage Disposal, Department of Public Service, in that it is immediately necessary to purchase coal for the preservation of the public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus, Ohio:

Section 1. That the Board of Purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into contract for approximately 500 tons of coal for the Division of Garbage Disposal, in accordance with specifications on file in the office of the Board of Purchase.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$2,500, or as much thereof as may be needed be and the same is hereby appropriated from the Garbage Disposal Fund No. 70 Code B, Materials and Supplies, to pay the cost thereof.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 492-55—Determining to proceed with the improving of Kenwick road, Wellesley road to 130 feet, more or less, south of south lot line of Scottwood road; Castlewood road, Kenwick road to Millerdale road; Belmar road, Castlewood road to Millerdale road; Clermont road, Castlewood road to 130 feet, more or less, east of east lot line of Millerdale road; Wilmore drive, Clermont road to Scottwood road; Scottwood road, 150 feet west of west lot line of Kenwick road to 130 feet, more or less, east of east lot line of Millerdale road; and Millerdale road, Berwick boulevard to Scottwood road, in the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Kenwick road, Wellesley road to 130 feet, more or less, south of south lot line of Scottwood road; Castlewood road, Kenwick road to Millerdale road; Belmar road, Castlewood road to Millerdale road; Clermont road, Castlewood road to 130 feet, more or less, east of east lot line of Millerdale road; Wilmore drive, Clermont road to Scottwood road; Scottwood road, 150 feet west of west lot line of Kenwick road to 130 feet, more or less, east of east lot line of Millerdale road; and Millerdale road, Berwick boulevard to Scottwood road, by grading, draining, constructing combined curb and gutter, Portland cement concrete base course, with bituminous tack coat and asphaltic concrete leveling and surface courses, the installation of water facilities, such water installations not to be assessed under this procedure, and doing such other things as may be necessary, in the city of Columbus, Ohio, in accordance with the resolution declaring it necessary to improve the same adopted by council January 24, 1955; and in accordance with the plans, profiles, specifications and estimate of cost therefor approved and now on file in the office of the department of public service.

Sec. 2. That the streets herein declared necessary to be improved are so situated in relation to each other that, in order to complete the improvement thereof in the most practical and economical manner, same should be improved at the same time, with the same kind of materials and in the same manner and shall be done under one contract.

Sec. 3. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after completion of the proposed improvement, and the city attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Sec. 4. That the whole cost of said improvement, together with interest on notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of bonds and on bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessment to be levied for said improvement and all other necessary expenditures, less three percent thereof, the cost of intersections and water facilities, shall be assessed in proportion to the special benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All lots and lands bounding or abutting upon the proposed im-
