

city treasurer of Columbus, Ohio, within thirty days from date of the publication of this ordinance or at the option of the owner in ten annual installments with interest upon deferred payments at the same rate as shall be borne by the bonds to be issued in anticipation of the collection of the same at the office of the county treasurer after the same have been certified to the county auditor for collection in the manner provided by law. The said assessment, after being so certified, however, may be paid in full or any number of annual installments may be paid at any tax collection time, with interest on the same to semi-annual interest day next ensuing.

Sec. 3. That the said assessment, and all portions thereof, when collected, shall be paid into the sinking fund and shall be applied to the payment of the bonds issued for said improvement and the interest thereon as the same shall become due, and to no other purpose whatsoever.

Sec. 4. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 502-29—Authorizing the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into the necessary contracts for the purchase of the following machinery and equipment to be installed in the municipal electric light plant.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the municipal electric light plant in that certain machinery and equipment is needed to provide for the increased demands for municipal current; therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1: That the board of purchase be, and the same is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into the necessary contracts for the purchase of the following machinery and equipment and he is hereby authorized to enter into the necessary contracts or by the direct employment of the necessary labor therefor to provide for the construction of foundations or the doing of other work not a part of the contract of purchase as may be necessary for installation of said machinery and equipment.

1—7500 3 phase 60 cycle 6900 volts condensing turbo-generating unit and appurtenances thereto.

1—Generator air cooler.
Material and labor for excavation and construction of foundation for turbo-generating unit.

1—Surface condenser.
1—Dual drive circulating pump.
2—Condensate pumps.
1—Air ejector.

Suction and discharge pipe lines for circulating and condensate pumps.
Main steam and auxiliary pipe lines.
