**AN ORDINANCE No. 57-59** — To vacate the first alley south of Mt. Vernon avenue (East Market street), extending from the east line of North Ohio avenue to the west line of North Champion avenue.

Whereas, petition signed by Columbus Metropolitan Housing Authority, owner of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley south of Mt. Vernon avenue, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley between the points named, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the first alley south of Mt. Vernon avenue (East Market street), extending from the east line of North Ohio avenue to the west line of North Champion avenue, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley hereby vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

**AN ORDINANCE No. 58-59** — To authorize the City Attorney to cause appraisals to be made on certain properties necessary for park purposes, in the vicinity of the Cranford School site and the University City Homes Subdivision and in the vicinity of the Arlington Park School.

Whereas, it is immediately necessary to have appraisals made in order to purchase real estate and to expedite the development of parks adjacent to recent schools sites for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the City Attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to have appraisals made by qualified real estate appraisers of property or real estate necessary for park purposes hereinafter described:

Situated in State of Ohio, County of Franklin and City of Columbus and being a proposed seven acre tract in the vicinity of the Cranford School site and the University City Homes Subdivision, as deline-

ated on Park Plan No. 74-T-59, prepared for Ray S. Dietz, Superintendent of the Division of Parks and Forestry, under date of January 14, 1959, and being a proposed seven acre tract in the vicinity of Arlington Park School, delineated on Park Plan No. 73-T-59, prepared for Ray S. Dietz, Superintendent of the Division of Parks and Forestry, under date of January 15, 1959.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$500.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated or as much as is needed for the within purposes from Parks, Lands, Buildings and Equipment Fund No. 1 to pay the cost of said appraisals and other incidentals in connection therewith.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

**AN ORDINANCE No. 59-59** — To authorize the purchase of a 6-inch type FM meter with bronze compound by-pass from the Hersey Manufacturing Company, 4935 West Belmont Avenue, Chicago 41, Illinois, and appropriate the funds therefor.

Whereas, due to the remodeling of the Short Street Incinerator, it is necessary to purchase a special compound meter in order to provide accurate measurement of the water necessary for efficient operation of this unit, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Water, Department of Public Service, in that it is immediately necessary to purchase a 6-inch Compound meter as manufactured by the Hersey Manufacturing Company in order to accurately measure the water supply necessary for the efficient operation of the Short Street Incinerator for the immediate preservation of public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Board of Purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to purchase from the Hersey Manufacturing Company, 4935 West Belmont Avenue, Chicago 41, Illinois, one 6-inch type FM meter with bronze compound by-pass, the Hersey Manufacturing Company being the only known source of supply for this particular type meter.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$1,297.84 be and the same is hereby appropriated from Water Works Fund No. 90, Code 710.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

**AN ORDINANCE No. 60-59** — To authorize the Director of Public Service to advertise and open bids for furnishing and installing all pipe, fittings and valves for a water line in Riverview Drive from Olentangy River Road west approximately 2,450 feet.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Water, Department of Public Service, in that it is immediately necessary to authorize the Director of Public Service to advertise and open bids for a water line in Riverview Drive from Olentangy River Road west in order to supply water service to newly

developed areas within the corporate limits of the City of Columbus for the immediate preservation of public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Service be and he is hereby authorized and director to advertise and open bids for the furnishing and installing all pipe, fittings and valves necessary for a water line in Riverview Drive from Olentangy River Road west approximately 2,540 feet, in accordance with specifications on file in said office of the Director of Public Service.

**AN ORDINANCE No. 61-59** — To authorize the board of purchase to advertise for bids and to enter into contracts for the purchase of certain equipment for use in connection with the operation of street cleaning; to trade in as part of the purchase price the worn out equipment listed and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, the division of engineering and construction has certain automotive and mechanical equipment presently being used in connection with the operation of street cleaning, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of engineering and construction, in that it is necessary to acquire certain new equipment for use in the operation of street cleaning in order to perform said operation more efficiently at the earliest possible time, thereby preserving the public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:
