AN ORDINANCE No. 574-51—To authorize the board of purchase to advertise for bids and to enter into a contract for the purchase of a passenger car and light truck type, full hydraulic, air-oil operated lift, with A.S.M.E. tank, for the division of water, department of public service, and to appropriate the money therefor.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of water, department of public service, in that the present hydraulic lift is worn out and is no longer fit for safe service, and the purchase of a new hydraulic lift is necessary for the preservation of the public peace, property, health and safety of the city of Columbus and the inhabitants thereof; now therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and to enter into a contract for the purchase of a passenger car and light truck type, full hydraulic, air-oil operated lift, with A.S.M.E. tank for the division of water, department of public service, in accordance with the lowest and best bid received.

AN ORDINANCE No. 575-51—To authorize the board of purchase to advertise for bids, to enter into contract or contracts, for the purchase of water meters for the division of water, department of public service, and to appropriate the money therefor.

Whereas, it is desirable that bids be taken and a contract be entered into at the earliest possible date as there is a shortage of water meters caused by the reduction of strategic materials available for the manufacture of water meters, due to Federal regulations; and,

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of water, department of public service, in that an accurate billing of water consumption is essential to the health and safety of the city of Columbus and the inhabitants thereof; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and to enter into a contract or contracts with the lowest and best bidder for water meters for the division of water, department of public service.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$52,000, or as much thereof as may be needed, be,

and the same is hereby appropriated from water works fund No. 90, code 602, to pay the cost and expense thereof.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 576-51—To vacate the first alley south of Spring street, extending from Cleveland avenue to the first alley west of Cleveland avenue.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the first alley south of Spring street, extending from Cleveland avenue to the first alley west of Cleveland avenue was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the limits named, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,
