AN ORDINANCE NO. 580-38—To accept the deed of easement of The Olentangy Village Housing Corporation of the city of Columbus, county of Franklin and state of Ohio, dated November 1, 1938.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the deed of easement of The Olentangy Village Housing Corporation to the city of Columbus, Ohio, dated November 1, 1938, for a strip of land 20 feet in width, the center line of which begins at a point on the center line of the Clintonville twenty-four, inch sanitary sewer, at its intersection with the south property line of the premises belonging to the Olentangy Village Housing Corporation, and more fully described in said deed of easement, be and the same is hereby accepted, for the purpose of constructing a stone masonry retaining wall along the east bank of the Olentangy river between the said river and the sanitary sewer now in place, to repair and maintain the same and to have the right of ingress and egress for said purposes.

Said grantee during the period of construction only, shall have the right to use temporarily such additional land as may be necessary immediately adjacent to the said land described in said easement.

If said retaining wall is not constructed within one year from the date thereof, this grant shall be null and void and of no effect.

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest and ought to be made; now, therefore,
