ORD. No. 598-62—To authorize and direct the Mayor to sign for the City of Columbus the necessary Fallout Shelter License or Privilege Agreements and to declare an emergency.
 Whereas, the City of Columbus, Ohio, the State of Ohio and the United States Government did enter into contract for the purpose of conducting a survey and evaluation and selection of all the fallout shelter resources located within the limits of the City of Columbus; and

Whereas, it is necessary that in order to maintain and equip such areas selected as suitable fallout shelters, a license or privilege must be obtained from the owner of such premises; and

Whereas, such license or privilege agreements must also be signed by the participating political subdivision, in addition to the State and the Federal Government; and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual and daily operation of the government of the City of Columbus, Ohio, in that it is immediately necessary that such licenses and privilege agreements be executed for the preservation of the public health, safety, and property; now, therefore

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus, Ohio:

Section 1. That the Mayor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to sign for and on behalf of the City of Columbus the necessary Fallout Shelter Licenses or Privilege Agreements for the purpose of marking, maintaining and equipping areas selected as shelter space within the City of Columbus, Ohio.

Sec. 2. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

ORD. No. 595-62—To vacate the alley west of Elizabeth Avenue, extending from the south line of Fair Avenue to the north line of Brentwood Road.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley west of Elizabeth Avenue, from Fair Avenue to Brentwood Road, was duly presented to this Council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points named, and

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Whereas, certain streets, by reason of unusually heavy use, require maintenance work beyond the scope of the facilities and labor available in the Division of Engineering and Construction; and

ORD. No. 598-62—To authorize the Board of Purchase to advertise and open bids for approximately 5,000 tons of sheet asphalt, asphalt binder and asphaltic concrete (limestone) and approximately 5,000 tons of sheet asphalt, asphalt binder and asphaltic concrete (gravel), for use in the Division of Engineering and Construction.

Whereas, sheet asphalt, asphalt binder and asphaltic concrete is necessary in connection with maintenance work of the Division of Engineering and Construction; and
