**ORD. No. 615-95** - To authorize the Director of the Department of Public Utilities to enter into contract with the Jess Howard Electric Co. for the installation of street lighting improvements in the Weber/Oakland Park area; to authorize payment to the Construction Inspection Division for inspection services to the Division of Electricity; and to authorize the expenditure of \$498,108.84 from Street Lighting and Electricity Distribution Improvements Fund, and to declare an emergency. (\$498,180.84)

WHEREAS, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Dept. of Utilities in that it is immediately necessary to pass this Ordinance as an emergency measure because it will allow construction to begin during construction season and that this is for the same reason necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health or safety, and;

WHEREAS, it is necessary to enter into a contract for labor and material to install an overhead and partial underground street lighting system in the Weber/Oakland Park area; and

WHEREAS, the Jesse Howard Electric Co. submitted the lowest responsive and responsible bid opened by the Director of Public Utilities on February 22, 1995; and

WHEREAS, construction inspection services to be provided by the Construction Inspection Division are required for the aforesaid contract; now, therefore

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:**

**Section 1.** That the Director of the Department of Public Utilities is hereby authorized to enter into contract with Jess Howard Electric Co. in the amount of \$453,180.84, for labor and material for the installation of an overhead and partial underground street lighting system in the Weber/Oakland Park area for the Division of Electricity.

**Section 2.** That the Director of Public Utilities is hereby authorized to obtain and pay for construction inspection services, in the amount of \$45,000.00, to be provided by the Construction Inspection Division for the aforesaid contract.

**Section 3.** That to pay the cost of the aforesaid contract and inspection costs, the expenditure of \$498,180.84, or so much thereof as may be needed, be and is hereby authorized from the Division of Electricity, Division No. 60-07, Subfund 08-946, Project No. 946147, Index Code 643908, Minor Code 6625.

**Section 4.** That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor, or ten days after its passage if the Mayor neither approves nor vetoes the same.

**ORD. No. 616-95** - To authorize the Director of the Department of Public Service to execute those documents necessary to transfer certain parcels of land located adjacent to Indianola Avenue, south of State Route 161, within the City limits of Worthington, to the Ohio Railway Museum, Inc.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 2895-91, passed December 23, 1991, the City of Columbus accepted certain parcels of real estate adjacent to Indianola Avenue, south of State Route 161, from Franklin County; and

WHEREAS, certain portions of the property accepted pursuant to said ordinance are actually located within the city limits of Worthington; and

WHEREAS, those parcels located in Worthington are the subject of an agreement dated October 31, 1958, between Franklin County and the Ohio Railway Museum, Inc., an Ohio corporation, fka Central Ohio Rail Fans Association, Inc., d.b.a. Ohio Railway Museum (hereinafter "Museum"); and

WHEREAS, said agreement allows the Museum to construct, operate and maintain railway tracks over said parcels; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Museum has voted to request the donation of those parcels subject to said agreement from the City of Columbus; and

WHEREAS, after investigation, it has been determined the City of Columbus has no interest rest in retaining ownership of said parcels; and

WHEREAS, Land Review Commission has voted to recommend the transfer of said parcels to the Ohio Railway Museum, Inc., at no charge; now, therefore

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:**

**Section 1.** That the Director of the Department of Public Service be and hereby is authorized to execute those documents necessary to transfer those parcels described in the attached Exhibit A to the Ohio Railway Museum, Inc., an Ohio corporation, fka Central Ohio rail Fans Association, Inc., d.b.a. Ohio Railway Museum.

**Section 2.** That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

WHEREAS, the City of Columbus is the owner of the remainder of that street park known as Rays Park and that Unimproved right-of-way known as Powell Circle; and

WHEREAS, there is a private bridge located within this public right-of-way, and

WHEREAS, the City Engineers Office desires to have the remainder of Roys Park and Powell Circle vacated to relieve the City of the responsibility to maintain said private bridge; and

WHEREAS, after investigation, it has been determined that there are no objections to the

vacation of this area, subject to the retention of a general utility easement in, on, over, across, under and through the area for the benefit of the City; now, therefore

**BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLUMBUS:**

**Section 1.** That the remainder of that street park known as Roys Park and that unimproved right-of-way known as Powell Circle, northwest of Powell Avenue (50' wide) and north of Ridge Avenue (50' wide), be and hereby is vacated.

**Section 2.** That a general utility easement in, on, over, across, under and through said vacated property be and hereby is reserved unto the City of Columbus.

**Section 3.** That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
