

ORDINANCES PASSED

AN ORDINANCE No. 59-31—To provide for the issue of bonds in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the improvements herein named.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That for the purpose of raising money in anticipation of the collection of special assessments for the improvement of Mound street from Fourth street to Parsons avenue by installing single light standards, underground cable and appurtenances there-to, in accordance with ordinance No. 747-29, passed October 7, 1929, bonds of said city shall be issued to the amount of \$14,900, to pay notes previously issued and about to mature.

Sec. 2. Said bonds shall be signed by the mayor and auditor, bear date not later than May 1, 1931, and shall be numbered and be due and payable as follows:

Bond numbered 1 shall be of the denomination of \$900, and bonds numbered from 2 to 15, inclusive, shall be of the denomination of \$1000 each, shall bear interest at the rate of four and one-half per cent per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of March and September of each year and for which the proper interest coupons bearing a facsimile of the signature of the auditor shall be attached to and made a part of said bonds.

Principal and interest shall be payable at the office of the agency of the city of Columbus, Ohio, in the city of New York. It is hereby stated and recited that the final tax settlement between the county treasurer and the city of Columbus, next following the inclusion of a tax for the issue of bonds herein provided for in the annual budget, as provided by law, will take place in August, 1932.

Sec. 3. For the purpose of providing necessary funds to pay the interest on the foregoing issue of bonds, promptly, when and as the same falls due, and also to provide a fund sufficient to discharge the said serial bonds at maturity, there shall be and is hereby levied on all the taxable property in the city of Columbus, in addition to all other taxes, a direct tax annually during the period said bonds are to run, in an amount sufficient to provide funds to pay the interest upon said bonds as and when the same shall fall due, and also to provide a fund for the discharge of the principal of said serial bonds at maturity, which tax shall not be less than the interest and sinking fund tax required by section 11 of article XII of the constitution. Provided, however, that in each year that the assessments anticipated by said bonds are payable and are applicable to the payment of such interest and principal and are appropriated for such purpose, the amount of such tax shall be reduced by the amount of the assessment so appropriated.

Said tax shall be and is hereby ordered computed, certified, levied and extended upon the tax duplicate and collected by the same officers, in the same manner and at the same time that taxes for general purposes for each of said years are certified, extended and collected. Said tax shall be placed before and in preference to all other items and for the full amount thereof. The funds derived from said tax levies hereby required, shall be placed in a separate and distinct fund, which, together with the interest collected on the same, shall be irrevocably pledged for the payment of principal and interest of said bonds when and as the same fall due.

Sec. 4. The city auditor is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this ordinance to the auditor of Franklin county, Ohio, according to law.

Sec. 5. That all installments of said

assessments and all portions thereof, together with interest thereon, shall be applied to the payment of said bonds and interest as the same shall become due and to no other purpose whatsoever.

Sec. 6. The committee on finance of this council is hereby directed to have said bonds and coupons properly prepared and executed, to sell the same and to deposit the proceeds in the city treasury to the credit of the following fund in the amount therein stated: Mound street from Fourth street

to Parsons avenue \$14,900 for the purpose of paying the portion of the cost of said improvement not heretofore provided to be paid by said city and for which purpose said money is hereby appropriated.

Sec. 7. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

Sec. 2. That the sum of five thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be needed, be, and the same is hereby appropriated from fund No. 90, 612, to pay the cost and expense of purchasing the above described materials.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 61-31—Authorizing and directing the director of public service to lay and maintain a 12-inch water main in alley east of Summit street from alley north of Crestview road to Weber road a distance of 764.71 feet, by direct employment of labor.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to lay and maintain a 12-inch water main in alley east of Summit street from alley north of Crestview road to Weber road a distance of approximately 764.71 feet by the direct employment of labor.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$3058.84, or as much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated from the main line extension fund, to pay the cost and expense of the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and

after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 62-31—To dedicate the property herein described for street and boulevard purposes.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following described property owned by the city of Columbus, Ohio, be and the same is hereby dedicated for street and boulevard purposes, to-wit:

Being a strip of land 140 feet in width, the center line of which is described as follows: Beginning at a point in the center line of Greenlawn avenue (bearing N. 73°-35' W.) said point being 75.3 feet more or less measured westwardly from the face of the west abutment of the bridge over the Scioto river; thence on a line curved to the west with a radius of 358.31 feet and a central angle of 74°-31', a distance of 464.46 feet, the bearing of the tangent to said curve at the point of beginning being N. 16°-25' E.; thence N. 58°-06' W. a distance of 1169.87 feet; thence on a line curved to the south with a radius of 759.58 feet and a central angle of 16°-12', a distance of 214.52 feet; thence N. 74°-18' W. a distance of 554.91 feet; thence on a line curved to the north with a radius of 891.16 feet and a central angle of 61°-22', a distance of 953.90 feet; thence N. 12°-56' W. a distance of 1428.38 feet; thence on a line curved to the east with a radius of 1838.90 feet and a central angle of 29°-57', a distance of 961.36 feet; thence on a line curved to the east with a radius of 5219.05 feet and a central angle of 11°-03', a distance of 1007.19 feet; thence on a line curved to the east with a radius of 2196.06 feet and a central angle of 2°-13', a distance of 85.26 feet to a point in the center line of Mound street, said point being 337.16 feet more or less measured eastwardly from the intersection of the said center line of Mound street with the center line of Evan avenue.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 63-31—To authorize payment of the claim of Pfeifer Show Print company for additional compensation in connection with the printing and publication of the Columbus code and to transfer and appropriate funds therefor.

Whereas, on or about the 30th day of October, 1929, the Pfeifer Show Print company entered into a contract with the city of Columbus, Ohio, to print, bind and deliver 500 copies of the Columbus code, containing 600 pages, more or less, for the sum of \$1381; and

Whereas, the said Pfeifer Show Print company after setting the type for the printing of said code was requested by the city of Columbus to change and revise various sections of said code, and make additions thereto, beyond the estimated number of pages, so that the said code, as completed, contains 756 pages; and,

Whereas, the said Pfeifer Show Print company by reason of said revision, holding type, and additional pages, have made claim for additional compensation in the sum of \$333.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the claim of the Pfeifer Show Print company in the sum of \$333 for additional compensation, in connection with the printing and publication of the Columbus code, as hereinabove set forth, be and the same is hereby recognized as a moral obligation of the city of Columbus, Ohio.
