AN ORDINANCE No. 632-46—To authorize the director of public service to advertise for bids and to enter into a contract for the construction of veterans housing project, McKinley playground site, sanitary sewer and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, council by ordinance No. 474-46, passed September 16, 1946, authorized the construction of lateral sewers in connection with temporary housing units within the corporate limits of the city and appropriated \$4,000.00 to the sewers and drains No. 12, sewer construction fund from the same fund to pay the cost thereof, and

Whereas, plans, specifications and estimate of cost have been prepared for the construction of such sanitary sewers, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of engineering and construction, in that it is immediately necessary to construct such sanitary sewers in order to relieve the existing housing shortage; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and to enter into a contract for the construction of veterans housing project, McKinley playground site, sanitary sewers, in accordance with marked CC-282, specifications and estimate of cost thereof, on file in the department of public service, which are hereby approved.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$3,000.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the veterans housing project, McKinley playground site, sanitary sewer fund, to pay the cost thereof.

AN ORDINANCE No. 633-46—Authorizing the trustees of the sinking fund of the city of Columbus, Ohio, to enter into a contract on behalf of said city with The Chase National Bank of New York City, for the said bank to act as paying agent in New York City, hereinafter provided.

Whereas, certain bonds of the city of Columbus, Ohio, and the coupons therefrom are made payable in New York City, and,

Whereas, it is necessary for the trustees of the sinking fund of Columbus, Ohio, to enter into a contract for the payment of these bonds and coupons therefrom which are presented for payment in New York City, during the calendar year 1947; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the trustees of the sinking fund of Columbus, Ohio, be and they are hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract for the period of one year beginning January 1, 1947, with The Chase National Bank of New York City, for said bank to act as paying agent for them in New York City for all bonds and coupons therefrom of the city of Columbus, payable in New York City, and which are due and payable at the time presented;

That the following terms and conditions: That The Chase National Bank shall act as paying agent for the trustees of the sinking fund of Columbus, Ohio, for the payment of all bonds and coupons therefrom of the city of Columbus, Ohio, which are payable by their terms in New York City, which are presented for payment during the period from January 1, 1947, to December 31, 1947, and which are due and payable at the time presented.

That the trustees of the sinking fund of Columbus, Ohio, shall compensate The Chase National Bank of New York City for these services on the following basis:  
The equivalent of 1/6th of 1% of the face amount thereof for the payment of coupons.  
The equivalent of 1/20th of 1% of the face amount thereof for the payment of bonds up to \$500,000 in face amount.  
The equivalent of 1/30th of 1% of the face amount thereof for the payment of bonds over \$500,000 in face amount.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law, upon the filing with the clerk of this council, its acceptance, in writing, of each and all of the terms and provisions of this ordinance by Rule Properties, Inc., and the payment of the cost of publication hereof.
