## ORDINANCES

AN ORDINANCE No. 578-53—To change the zoning map attached to ordinance No. 38852 passed February 27, 1928, and as subsequently amended as herein provided.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Zoning map attached to Ordinance No. 38852, passed February 27, 1928, and as subsequently amended be and the same is hereby revised by changing the zoning of the property

Lots No. 1 to 19 inclusive of the Northridge Subdivision located at a point north of Richards Road and a point north of Blenheim Road on North High Street,

from a Type "D" Business district to an A-1 Dwelling House district and the Engineer of the Planning Commission be and he is hereby authorized and directed to make the said change on the said original zoning map in the office of the Division of Building Regulations and the office of the City Planning Commission.

AN ORDINANCE No. 643-53—To accept the plat of certified homes subdivision.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the plat of certified homes subdivision, being a subdivision situated in the state of Ohio, county of Franklin, city of Columbus, quarter twp. 1, twp. 1 N., range 18 W., U. S. Military Lands, containing 15.62 acres described in 4 deeds to Certified Homes, inc., as follows: a 2 acre tract of record in deed book 1755, pages 555 and 557; a 9.24 acre tract of record in deed book 1752, page 89, and a 4.38 acre tract of record in deed book 1752, page 82, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, said subdivision extending north of Oakland Park avenue and west of

Maize road, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Sec. 2. AN ORDINANCE No. 668-53—To vacate the second alley north of Broad street, from the first alley east of Garfield avenue to Tallmadge street.

Whereas, petition signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the second alley north of Broad street from the first alley east of Garfield avenue to Tallmadge street was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points named, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the second alley north of Broad street, from the first alley east of Garfield avenue to Tallmadge street, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to install, operate and maintain sewers water lines and other public utilities owned by the said city and the right is reserved to install, operate and maintain any and all other public utilities in said alley so vacated and shall have the right to enter thereon for the purpose of such installation, replacement, operation and maintenance.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law and upon the acceptance of a deed for a triangular tract of land out of the northeast corner of lot No. 1 of T. W. Tallmadge's addition to the city of Columbus and the dedication thereof to public use for alley purposes.

AN ORDINANCE No. 669-53—To authorize the director of public service to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the improvement of a number of streets, and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, the surface of a number of streets requires maintenance work which may best be performed by the application of bituminous treated aggregate, and

Whereas, the making of such improvements is beyond the scope of the labor and equipment facilities of the division of engineering and construction, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of engineering and construction, in that such surfacing work must be done during the heat of the summer months when temperatures are at the extreme height in order that the application of such materials adhere and bond properly to the existing pavements; now, therefore,
