AN ORDINANCE No. 698-61—To accept the plat of The Knolls, Section No. 2. Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the plat of The Knolls, Section No. 2, situated in the County of Franklin, State of Ohio, City of Columbus and being a part of Lots 16 and 17 of the Scioto Company's lands located in Quarter Township 2, Township 1 North, Range 18 West (formerly Clinton Township), United States Military Lands, containing in all 42.445 acres of which 40.087 acres are a part of the 60.91 acre tract conveyed to "The Knolls Development Company" as Parcel II in a deed of record in Deed Book 2308, page 511, and 2.358 acres are a part of a 2.168 acre tract and a 73.062 acre tract, both as conveyed to Evans Investment Company and shown of record in Auditor's Affidavit Book 20, page 175, Auditor's Office, Franklin County, Ohio, said 2.358 acres conveyed to "The Knolls Development Company" being shown of record in Deed Book 2322, page 276, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio, and lying west of Olentangy River Road and north of The Knolls Subdivision, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon Rush Alley, from Mill Street to McDowell Street, was duly presented to this Council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points named, and

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That Rush Alley, extending from the east line of Mill Street to the west line of the alley east of Mill Street; from the east line of the alley east of Mill Street to the west line of May Avenue; from the east line of May Avenue to the west line of the alley east of May Avenue; and from the east line of the alley east of May Avenue to the west line of McDowell Street, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the City of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewer, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the City, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in that portion of the alley hereby vacated, extending from the east line of the alley east of May Avenue to the west line of McDowell Street, and shall have the right to enter therein at any time for the purpose of replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

- No. 1 — Being a strip of land 5.0 feet in width off the south side of Lot No. 775, extending from the west line of Kelburn Road (vacated) westwardly to a point 5.0 feet east of the west line of said Lot No. 775.
- No. 2 — Being a strip of land 5.0 feet in width off the north side of
