AN ORDINANCE No. 707-54--To authorize the purchase of the property herein described for waterworks extension purposes, Big Walnut Water Project (Hoover Dam and Reservoir) and appropriating the money therefor.
Whereas, the acquisition of the property described herein is immediately necessary in order that the contract for construction of said dam, and clearing and grubbing of the reservoir area may proceed without delay, for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the City of Columbus:
Section 1. That in accordance with the acceptance by the owner of the offer made by the coordinator of Hoover Dam and Reservoir, the Director of Public Service be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to purchase, in fee simple, the following property:

Being in Lots 12 and 13, Section No. 4, Township No. 4, Range No. 17, United States Military Lands, Delaware County, State of Ohio and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point in the center of the Columbus-Wooster Road, said point of beginning being the northwest corner of a 2.94 acre tract of land now or formerly owned by Edward and Christine Hollis; thence with Hollis' west line south 6°-25' east 661.17 feet to a point in the center of Little Walnut Creek; thence with the center of said creek south 37°-24' west 340.65 feet and south 52°-40' west 59.20 feet to a point in the center of said creek, said point being a northeast corner of a 10.15 acre tract of land now or formerly owned by Samuel M. Michener; thence with Michener's north line north 87°-09' west 669.38 feet to an iron pipe on Michener's line; thence continuing along Michener's line north 3°-20' east 463.71 feet to an iron pipe on Michener's north line, said iron pipe being the southwest corner of a 1.52 acre tract of land now or formerly owned by Vera H. Fox; thence with the south line of the Fox property south 88°-57' east 175.34 feet to an iron pipe, said iron pipe being the southeast corner of the said Fox property; thence with the east line of the said Fox property north 3°-45' east 365.22 feet to a point in the center of the Columbus-Wooster Road; thence with the center of said road south 88°-55' east 82.88 feet to a point in the center of said road; thence continuing along the center of said road north 78°-53' east 556.54 feet to the point of beginning; all bearings being referred to the true meridian and containing 15.45 acres more or less.

from Bessie R. Sheets and any other person or persons having an interest therein, for the sum of \$21,000, same to be free and clear of all encumbrances excepting taxes due the June, 1954 collection period and thereafter; as additional consideration, owner may retain possession of the premises until September 1, 1954, rent free, and owner may farm and graze cattle on said land until December 31, 1954 at her own risk, and owner may remove any sod,

trees, shrubs, flowers, or bushes from the premises.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$21,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary, be and the same is hereby appropriated from Waterworks Enlargement Fund No. 16 for the payment of the purchase price of said property, which shall be paid on vouchers signed by the Director of Public Service after approval by the City Attorney of the titles and deeds therefor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 708-54--To authorize the purchase of repair parts for Boiler Feed Water Pumps now in use at the Scioto River Pumping Station, Division of Water, Department of Public Service, without advertising for bids and to appropriate the money therefor.

Whereas, the Boiler Feed Water Pumps now in use at the Scioto River Pumping Station were manufactured by the Worthington Pump and Machinery Corporation, and

Whereas, spare Rotor Assemblies have been carried in stock and in the process of overhauling the steam boilers these said Rotor Assemblies have been installed in the equipment, and

Whereas, it is necessary to provide additional Rotor Assemblies to be carried in stock in case of an emergency breakdown, since the high pressure boilers could not be used without this equipment, and

Whereas, the Worthington Pump and Machinery Corporation is the only source of supply for this particular equipment since the original installation was furnished by this company and their equipment is covered by United States Patents, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Water, Department of Public Service, and that it is necessary to have repair parts in stock in case of a breakdown of the equipment to insure the continuous operation of this equipment for the preservation of public health, peace, property, and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of The City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Board of Purchase be and it is hereby authorized and directed to purchase a complete Rotor B Assembly for Worthington Boiler Feed Water Pump 1-1/2 UB-2 Pump No. 1347858, and one Rotor B Assembly complete for Worthington Boiler Feed Water Pump No. 2UB-2 No. 1288522-3, from the Worthington Pump and Machinery Corporation, 522 Terminal Tower, Cleveland 13, Ohio, the only source of supply, without advertising for bids.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$1,300, or as much thereof as may be needed, be and the same is hereby appropriated from Water Works Fund No. 90, Code 300, to pay the cost and expense thereof.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 709-54--To vacate the alley west of Souder avenue, from the north line of the alley north of Scott street to its north terminus.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owner of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley west of Souder avenue, from the north line of the alley north of Scott street to its north terminus, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points named, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley west of Souder avenue, from the north line of the alley north of Scott street to its north terminus, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and other public utilities owned by the said city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any and all other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley so vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of constructing, installing, replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 710-54--To authorize the director of public service to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the construction of the Whitehead road storm sewer, from Salisbury road to the alley west of Crescent road, and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, the development of the property on the south side of Sullivant avenue, west of Westgate avenue, necessitates the furnishing of storm sewer facilities, and

Whereas, the construction of an outlet for such storm sewer facilities into the existing Sullivant avenue storm sewer at Westgate avenue would cause said Sullivant avenue storm sewer to flow at full capacity, and

Whereas, the most practical and adequate outlet for such storm sewer facilities will be had through the construction of a 39-inch storm sewer in Whitehead road from Salisbury road to the alley west of Crescent road, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of sewerage and drainage, in that construction of said storm sewer is immediately necessary for the disposal of storm water, thereby preserving the public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the construction of the Whitehead road storm sewer, from Salisbury road to the alley west of Crescent road, in accordance with the plans marked MM-504, and the specifications therefor on file in the office of said director of public service, which are hereby approved.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$14,000, or so much thereof as may be needed, be and it is hereby appropriated from the maintenance and repair No. 65-602 fund, to pay the cost thereof.
