Reg. Meeting, Monday, April 3, 1939
(No. 14)

ORDINANCES

*AN ORDINANCE NO. 73-39—To change the name of Clifton avenue north, between Clifton avenue and Greenway south.

Whereas, Clifton avenue north, between Clifton avenue and Greenway south, is a continuation of Sherborne drive; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the name of Clifton avenue north, between Clifton avenue and Greenway south, be and it is hereby changed to Sherborne drive.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 85-39—To authorize the director of public service to advertise for bids and enter into a

contract or lease for the rental of rooms 108, 109, 110, 111, 112, 113 and No. 9, in the administration building, Port Columbus, and for the exclusive right to conduct restaurant and concession business in the airport restaurant and shelter-pavilion and on the municipal airport property owned by the city of Columbus, including the use of the restaurant equipment located therein.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of municipal airport, in that it is immediately necessary to advertise for bids and lease or contract for the use of the Port Columbus restaurant and equipment for the proper enjoyment of the public in the use thereof and for the immediate preservation of public property; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be, and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and enter into a contract or lease for the use and operation of the restaurant building at Port Columbus, owned by the city of Columbus, including the use of the restaurant equipment located therein and the shelter house and pavilion just west of the administration building for a period of one year, with the privilege of renewing said lease or contract for an additional year, and that all bids after being submitted be forwarded to council for approval.

Sec. 2. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 86-39—To limit the parking of vehicles on both sides of Third street from Mound street to Fulton street.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the parking of vehicles on both sides of Third street from Mound street to Fulton street, be and the same is hereby prohibited for a period longer than one hour between the hours of 8:00 a. m. and 6:00 p. m., Sundays and holidays excepted.

Sec. 2. That for the violation of this ordinance the penalty as fixed in the official traffic code of the city of Columbus shall apply and be in force.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
