AN ORDINANCE NO. 743-51—To vacate Vinton alley, from Livingston avenue to Stauring street.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owner of all lots and lands abutting upon Vinton alley, from Livingston avenue to Stauring street, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the limits named, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

AN ORDINANCE NO. 746-51—To authorize the director of public service to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the construction of Westgate Park and Southview Park Shelterhouses Sanitary Sewer Service

extensions, and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, it is deemed necessary to construct Westgate Park and Southview Park Shelterhouses Sanitary Sewer Service extensions to provide sewage service for the new shelterhouses; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids and to enter into contract for the construction of Westgate Park and Southview Park Shelterhouses Sanitary Sewer Service extensions, in accordance with the plans marked MM-457 and specifications on file in the office of the director of public service, which are hereby approved.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 747-51—To accept the warranty deed of the Westmoor Building company, dated July 18, 1951; to dedicate the premises therein conveyed to public use for street purposes, and to name the same.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the warranty deed of the Westmoor Building company, dated July 18, 1951, conveying the hereinafter described premises to the city of Columbus, be and the same is hereby accepted and the premises so conveyed are hereby dedicated to public use for street purposes:

Being part of lot No. 11 of Robert E. Neil, sole surviving trustee of John G. Neil and family subdivision of lot 17, city of Columbus, Ohio, as said lot No. 11 is numbered and delineated in recorder's plat book 4, page 130, Franklin county records. Description of cul-de-sac extension of 7th avenue.

Beginning at an iron pin on the west line of above mentioned lot No. 11 and on the south line of and east terminus of existing 7th avenue; said point of beginning being also the northeast corner of lot No. 3 of Westwood 7th avenue subdivision, as the same is numbered and delineated in recorder's plat book 21, page 17, Franklin county records; thence S. 84° 33' E. along the projection of the south line of 7th avenue a distance of 71.0 feet to an iron pin, marking the point of tangency of a curve having a radius of 46 feet, and central angle of 243° 23'.

Thence continuing along the arc of said curve, the following chord bearings and distances: N. 77° 41' E. 28.41 feet to a corner of parcels 4 and 5. N. 32° 37' E. 41.88 feet to corner of parcels 3 and 4. N. 22° 26' W. 42.95 feet to corner of parcels 2 and 3. N. 71° 15' W. 33.0 feet to corner of parcels 1 and 2. S. 59° 53' W. 42.94 feet to an iron pin on point of curvature of a curve having a radius of 30 feet, central angle of 63° 24', and tangency of 18.53 feet. Thence continuing along the arc of last mentioned curve to an iron pin, the chord length of said arc being 31.52 feet. Thence N. 84° 33' W. a distance of 3.2 feet along the projected north line of existing 7th avenue to an iron pin on said north line of 7th

avenue, being also the eastern terminus of 7th avenue and the southeast corner of lot 2 of Westwood 7th avenue subdivision as recorded in plat book 21, page 17, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio. Thence S. 5° 30' W. along the west line of said lot No. 11 a distance of 50 feet to the place of beginning.

Sec. 2. That the premises so conveyed and dedicated be and the same are hereby named Seventh avenue.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE NO. 748-51—To authorize the board of purchase to advertise for bids and enter into a contract for the purchase of 2200 tons of 46D aggregate stone to be delivered to Westgate Park.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of parks and forestry No. 76, department of public service, in that the purchase of 2200 tons of 46D aggregate stone to be delivered to Westgate Park is immediately necessary for the construction of a parking area, for the preservation of public health and safety; now, therefore,
