AN ORDINANCE No. 775-60 — To authorize the director of public service to enter into a contract for the construction of the Duxberry Park Subdivision Sanitary Sewers and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof including the costs of the necessary easements, advertising, printing, inspection and contingencies incident thereto.

Whereas, Ordinance 512-60 passed April 25, 1960 authorized the director of public service to advertise for and open bids for the construction of the Duxberry Park Subdivision Sanitary Sewers, and

Whereas, an acceptable bid for the construction of the said sewer was received on May 31, 1960, and,

Whereas, it has been determined that the said bid is the lowest and best bid and should be accepted in order to get the work underway at the earliest possible moment, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of sewerage and drainage in that the construction of the Duxberry Park Subdivision Sanitary Sewers is needed at the earliest possible time to expedite the furnishing of sanitary facilities to a considerable number of existing dwellings thereby preserving and protecting the public peace, property, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract for the construction of the Duxberry Park Subdivision Sanitary Sewers and to pay the cost thereof including the costs of the necessary easements, advertising, printing, inspection and contingencies incident thereto.

AN ORDINANCE No. 776-60 — To authorize the purchase in fee simple of certain parcels of land necessary for runway extension project at Port Columbus in the area West of Stelzer Road adjacent to the airport west boundary and in the line of westerly extension of Runway 9L-27R.

Whereas, this Council by Ordinance No. 189-60 and Ordinance No. 271-60, authorized and directed the City Attorney to purchase for and on behalf of the City of Columbus certain parcels of real estate for runway extension project at Port Columbus; and,

Whereas, the City Attorney has caused appraisals to be made of said parcels of land determining the fair market value thereof; and,

Whereas, certain owners of some of said parcels of land have agreed to convey the parcels owned by them to the City of Columbus for a monetary consideration no greater than said appraisals; and,

Whereas, the acquisition of the said parcels of land hereinafter described is immediately necessary in order that

there will be no delay in the construction of said runway extension for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That in accordance with the agreement of the owners to convey to the City of Columbus in fee simple the following hereinafter described real estate, the City Attorney or one of his assistants, designated by him, is hereby authorized and directed to purchase the following described premises:

Parcel No. 2.

Situated in the State of Ohio, County of Franklin, Township of Mifflin, and bounded and described as follows:

Being part of Section 3, Township I, Range 17, U.S.M. Lands and more particularly described as follows:

Beginning in the center of the Stelzer Road 1262.1 feet from the center line of the Columbus and Johnstown free pike at the northeast corner of the three acre tract deeded to Roy Booth as recorded in deed record 878, page 328; thence west along the north line of said three acre tract 459.4 feet to a point; thence north along the west line of the land of grantors 94.5 feet to a point; thence east and parallel with the north line of said three acre tract 463.8 feet to the center of the Stelzer Road; thence south along the center line of said road 94.5 feet to the place of beginning.

AN ORDINANCE No. 777-60 — To appropriate funds to pay the cost of resurfacing a portion of the city owned parking area lying north of the City Hall Annex and extending from Front Street to Ludlow Street, and to declare an emergency.

Whereas, the city owned parking area lying north of the City Hall Annex and extending from Front Street to Ludlow Street and presently being used by the Department of Public Safety is in need of resurfacing, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in that it is immediately necessary to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof in order that the work may proceed without delay thereby maintaining the convenience and welfare of the Department of Public Safety; now, therefore,

AN ORDINANCE No. 778-60 — To vacate Schreyer Place, from the west line of Olentangy Boulevard to the east line of Starret Road.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon Schreyer Place, from Olentangy Boulevard to Starret Road, was duly presented to this Council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said street, between the limits named, and

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, and that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the department of public service, division of engineering and construction, in that such vacation should be made immediately so that the DeRoberts Heights Subdivision may be accepted by the City of Columbus, thereby preserving the public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

That the City of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the City, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said street hereby vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor.
