AN ORDINANCE No. 778-57—To vacate the alley south of Scott street, from the east line of Glenwood avenue to the west line of Cypress avenue.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley south of Scott street, from Glenwood avenue to Cypress avenue, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points named, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

AN ORDINANCE No. 781-57—To accept the application for the annexation of certain territory to the City of Columbus.

Whereas, an amended petition for the annexation of certain territory in Jefferson and Truro Townships was duly filed by Thelma C. Lewis, et al.; and,

Whereas, the said amended petition was duly considered by the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, on October 5, 1956; and,

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners has approved the annexation of the said territory to the City of Columbus as hereinafter described; and,

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners certified the transcript of the proceedings in connection with said annexation with the map and amended petition required in connection therewith to the city clerk who received same on October 9, 1956; and,

Whereas, sixty days from the date of said filing have now elapsed in accordance with the provisions of Sec. 709.04 of the Revised Code of Ohio; and,

Whereas, an emergency exists in that it is necessary to annex said territory as soon as possible for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the proposed annexation as applied for in the amended petition of Thelma C. Lewis and a majority of the freeholders residing in the territory sought to be annexed and filed with the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, on June 25, 1956, and which said petition, as subsequently amended, prayed for annexation to the city of Columbus, Ohio of certain territory adjacent thereto as hereinafter described, and which said amended petition was approved for annexation to the city of Columbus by the Board of County Commissioners on October 5, 1956, be and the same is hereby accepted. Said territory is described as follows:

Located in Jefferson and Truro Townships, Franklin County, Ohio, and described as follows:

Beginning at an angle in the existing city of Columbus Corporation line at the intersection of the northerly line of the Columbus-Newark Road (66 feet in width) and the westerly line of the Taylor Station Road (60 feet in width);

Thence northerly, with the existing city of Columbus Corporation line, the westerly line of the Taylor Station Road (60 feet in width), a distance of 2000 feet, more or less, to an angle in the existing city of Columbus Corporation line, the southerly line of the Mary A. Baker 10.035 acre tract;

Thence easterly, with the southerly line of the Mary A. Baker 10.035 acre tract, and said line extended easterly, a distance of 60 feet, more or less, to the easterly line of Taylor Station Road (60 feet in width);

Thence northerly, with the easterly line of Taylor Station Road (60 feet in width), a distance of 470 feet, more or less, to the southerly line of the Columbus Clay Mfg. Co. 1.0 acre tract;

Thence easterly, with the southerly line of the Columbus Clay Mfg. Co. 1.0 acre tract, a distance of 160 feet, more or less, to the southeasterly corner of said 1.0 acre tract;

Thence northerly, with the easterly line of the Columbus Clay Mfg. Co. 1.0 acre tract, a distance of 220 feet, more or less, to the southerly line of South Alley (25 feet in width) in Taylor Station;

Thence easterly, with the southerly line of South Alley (25 feet in width), a distance of 63 feet, more or less, to the easterly line of Elm Street (25 feet in width) in Taylor Station;

Thence northerly, with the easterly line of said Elm Street (25 feet in width), a distance of 716 feet, more or less, to the southerly right-of-way line of the B. & O. and the P.C.C. & St. L. R. R., the northerly line of the Hawks Hospital of Mt. Carmel Association 5.17 acre tract;

Thence southeasterly, with the southerly right-of-way line of the B. & O. and the P.C.C. & St. L. R. R., the northerly line of the Hawks Hospital of Mt. Carmel Association 5.17 acre tract, a distance of 320 feet, more or less, to the easterly line of said Hawks Hospital of Mt. Carmel Association 5.17 acre tract;

Thence northeasterly, with the southerly right-of-way line of the B. & O. and the P.C.C. & St. L. R. R., the northerly lines of the Hawks Hospital of Mt. Carmel Association 63.745 acre and 68.125 acre tracts, a distance of 1268.3 feet, more or less, to the northwesterly corner of the Thelma C. Lewis 46.16 acre tract;

Thence northeasterly with the southerly right-of-way line of the B. & O. and the P.C.C. & St. L. R. R., the northerly line of said Thelma C. Lewis 46.16 acre tract, a distance of 1528 feet, more or less, to the northeasterly corner of said 46.16 acre tract;

Thence southerly, with the right-of-way line of the B. & O. and the P.C.C. & St. L. R. R. and the easterly line of the Thelma C. Lewis 46.16 acre tract, a distance of 10.7 feet, more or less, to the northwesterly corner of the John T. and Margaret L. Tompkins 73.526 acre tract;

Thence northeasterly, with the southerly right-of-way line of the B. & O. and the P.C.C. & St. L. R. R., the northerly line of the John T. and Margaret L. Tompkins 73.526 acre tract, the northerly line of the Diversified Construction Services Corp. 64.839 acre tract, a distance of 1850 feet, more or less, to the northeasterly corner of said Diversified Construction Services Corp. 64.839 acre tract;

Thence southerly, with the easterly line of the Diversified Construction Services Corp. 64.839 acre tract, a distance of 4224 feet, more or less, to a point in the northerly line of the Columbus-Newark Road (66 feet in width);

Thence northeasterly, with the northerly line of the Columbus-Newark Road (66 feet in width), a distance of 3375 feet, more or less, to a point in the westerly line of the Reynoldsburg-New Albany Road (60 feet in width);

Thence southeasterly, with the westerly line of the Reynoldsburg-New Albany Road (60 feet in width), a distance of 1900 feet, more or less, to a point in the southerly line of Jefferson Township;

Thence westerly, with the southerly line of Jefferson Township, a distance of 4250 feet, more or less, to the southeasterly corner of the James F. and Ida E. Worster 2.72 acre tract;

Thence northerly, with the easterly line of James F. and Ida E. Worster 2.72 acre tract, a distance of 929 feet, more or less, to a point in the southerly line of the Columbus-Newark Road (66 feet in width);

Thence southwestwardly with the southerly line of the Columbus-Newark Road (66 feet in width), a distance of 425 feet, more or less, to a point in the westerly line of James F. & Ida E. Worster 2.72 acre tract;

Thence southerly, with the westerly line of James F. and Ida E. Worster 2.72 acre tract, a distance
