

**Section 1.** That the warranty deed from Automotive Distributors, Inc., dated April 7, 1975, for the hereinafter described real estate, be and the same is hereby accepted and the premises so deeded be and the same are hereby dedicated to public use for roadway purposes:

**Section 2.** That Section 14-A11 of Ordinance No. 1717-74, as amended, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

**Section 14-A11.** Notwithstanding the other provisions of Section 14, that department heads appointed by the Mayor, including the Executive Assistant to the Mayor, and the Deputy Service Director, may be granted vacation leave with pay at the discretion of the Mayor but may not accumulate any vacation leave during the term of employment in one or more of these positions. The City Clerk and the City Treasurer may be granted vacation leave with pay at the discretion of the President of the City Council but may not accumulate vacation leave during the term of employment in one or more of these positions, or be paid for any vacation leave not taken during the term of employment in one or more of these positions. The Civil Service Commission Executive Secretary may be granted vacation leave with pay at the discretion of the Civil Service Commission but may not accumulate vacation leave during the term of employment in this position, or be paid for any vacation leave not taken during the term of employment in this position. Excepting and providing that in the event a department head appointed by the Mayor, including the Executive Assistant to the Mayor, and the Deputy Service Director, dies while in office, vacation leave may, at the discretion of the Mayor, be accrued pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance and payable upon death, and further excepting and providing that in the event that the City Clerk or City Treasurer, dies while in office, vacation leave may, at the discretion of the President of City Council, be accrued pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance and payable upon death. Also, further excepting and providing that in the event that the Civil Service Executive Secretary dies while in office, vacation leave may, at the discretion of the Civil Service Commission, be accrued pursuant to the provisions of this Ordinance and payable upon death.
