

AN ORDINANCE No. 795-49—To authorize payment of the claim of Mrs. Loye J. Bostwick, 1180 East Broad street, Columbus, Ohio.

Whereas, on or about August 18, 1949, Mrs. Bostwick had her car parked in a private parking lot at 2954 East Main street and a city truck, license No. OQ 412 entered the said area and collided with the rear of her automobile damaging the same; and,

Whereas, the said Mrs. Loye J. Bostwick, through no fault of her own, has suffered damages in the reasonable sum of \$14.50 by reason of said accident; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the claim of Mrs. Loye J. Bostwick, in the amount of \$14.50 for damages sustained on or about August 18, 1949, as hereinabove set forth, be and the same is hereby recognized as a legal claim against the city of Columbus.

Sec. 2. That for the purpose of paying said claim, there be and hereby is appropriated from general miscellaneous 21-H fund the sum of \$14.50.

Sec. 3. That the city auditor be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant upon the city treasurer in the sum of \$14.50 in payment of said claim, upon receipt of voucher approved, by the city attorney and a release properly executed by said Loye J. Bostwick of all damages arising out of said accident.

Sec. 4. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 796-49—To permit the occupancy and use of that part of the west side of Calumet street between Lakeview avenue and Pacemont Road now encroached upon by the east side of a two-story frame house known as 233 E. Lakeview avenue.

Whereas, in the erection of said building on the east 26.9 feet of lot No. 36 of E. J. Swerer's North High street addition, plat book 7, page 68, recorder's office, Franklin County, Ohio, the east side of said building was so constructed that it extended over and encroached upon the west side of Calumet street a distance of 0.3 of a foot measured along the north and south walls of said building, and has since and does now occupy and encroach upon said portion of said street; and,

Whereas, said encroachment does not interfere with the use of said street for street purposes; and,

Whereas, the cost of the removal of said building would be entirely out of proportion to the value thereof for highway purposes; and,

Whereas, the owners of said property have requested this Council to permit the occupancy and use of said portion of said street during the time said building continues to so occupy the same; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the owners, their successors and assigns, of the east 26.9 feet of lot No. 36 of E. J. Swerer's North High street addition, plat book 7, page 68, recorder's office, Franklin County, Ohio, on which is located a two-story frame house known as 233 E. Lakeview avenue, which building encroaches upon the west side of Calumet street 0.3 of a foot as measured along the north and south walls of said building, be and they are hereby granted permission to use and occupy said portion of said street upon which said building so encroaches, until such time as said building may be razed or removed therefrom; that the occupation of said portion of said street by said building is permitted as an accommodation to said owners, their successors and assigns, and no right, title or interest of the public is waived or abridged in any way thereby; and that

said owner shall pay the cost of the publication of this ordinance.

Sec. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 797-49—To authorize the director of public service to advertise for bids for rental of equipment by the division of water of the department of public service.

Whereas, certain construction, operation and maintenance work in the division of water of the department of public service cannot be carried out economically and with dispatch without the use of certain equipment such as a shovel excavator, back hoe, drag line, clam shell crane, bulldozer and trucks suitable for the laying of water mains, the storing of coal, and other uses; and,

Whereas, the city does not now have enough of such equipment, and it is considered more economical to rent said equipment when and as needed; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for bids for the rental of excavating equipment, cranes, bulldozers, and trucks for the laying of water mains and other uses.

Sec. 2. That the rental contract or contracts so entered into shall terminate at the close of the year 1950.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 798-49—To authorize the purchase of repair sleeves for the division of water of the department of public service, without advertising for bids and to provide the money therefor.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of water, department of public service, in that it is necessary to immediately replenish the stock of repair sleeves in order to give ample protection to the city water supply against emergency breaks and that such purchases are therefore essential to the health and safety of the city of Columbus and the inhabitants thereof; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase, under authority of the Ohio Municipal Code 3965, be and it is hereby authorized to purchase, without advertising for bids, 14 repair sleeves for 36-inch cast-iron pipe for the division of water of the department of public service.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$2,000, or as much thereof as may be needed be and the same is hereby appropriated from Code 201, Fund No. 90 of the division of water, for the purchase of said repair sleeves.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 799-49—To accept the warranty deed of Michael J. Ready, Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Columbus, dated September 30, 1949, and dedicate the premises there conveyed to public use for street purposes.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the warranty deed of Michael J. Ready, Bishop of the Catholic Diocese of Columbus, dated September 30, 1949, conveying the hereinafter described property to the city of Columbus, Ohio, be and it is hereby accepted and the premises so conveyed are hereby dedicated to public use for street purposes:

Being fourteen and one half feet off of the south ends of lots number seventy seven, seventy eight, seventy nine, eighty, eighty one, eighty two and eighty three of Rickett's and Ady's Fairday addition, as the same are numbered and delineated upon the recorded plat thereof, of record in plat book 4, page 278, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio.

AN ORDINANCE No. 800-49—To vacate a 15 foot easement, abutting lots Nos. 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 of Indian Springs Village, block C, and extending from Henderson road to a point west thereof.

Whereas, a petition, signed by the owner of all lots and lands (lots Nos. 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 of Indian Springs Village, block C) abutting upon a 15 foot easement and extending from Henderson road to a point west thereof, conveyed to the city of Columbus through acceptance of the plat of Indian Springs Village, block C, and the dedication of all streets, avenues, roads, alleys and easements, accepted and dedicated by ordinance No. 265-47, passed May 19, 1947, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said easement, between the limits named, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the 15 foot easement, for a walk abutting lots Nos. 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 of Indian Springs Village, block C, and extending from Henderson road to a point west thereof, be and the same is hereby vacated.

AN ORDINANCE No. 801-49—Determining to proceed with the construction of main trunk storm relief sewers in the district bounded on the west by the alley east of High street, from the south line of the lots abutting Wetmore road to the north corporation line; on the north by the north corporation line, from the alley east of High street to Indianola avenue; on the east by the west line of Indianola avenue, from the north corporation line to the south line of the lots abutting the south side of Wetmore road, and on the south by the south line of the lots abutting Wetmore road, from Indianola avenue to the alley east of High street, to the place of beginning, in the city of Columbus, Ohio.
