AN ORDINANCE No. 81-55—To vacate the alley east of Chesterfield road, extending from Astor avenue to Mound street.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley east of Chesterfield road, extending from Astor avenue to Mound street, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points named, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley east of Chesterfield road, extending from Astor avenue to Mound street, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley hereby vacated, and does further reserve unto itself perpetual easement for the full width of the alley for the purposes of installing or constructing any new utility facilities, either publicly or privately owned, which may become necessary, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of constructing, installing, replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 82-55—To authorize and direct the Director of Public Service to advertise for and to open bids for the construction of Truro Relief Sewer Part 2 and to appropriate funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, Ordinances 1572-54 and 1591-54 passed November 22, 1954 and November 29, 1954 respectively authorized the preparation of detailed plans for Truro Relief Sewer, Part 2, and

Whereas, the detailed plans for the Truro Relief Sewer, Part 2, have now been completed, and it is determined that it is now necessary to advertise for and to open bids for the construction of Truro Relief Sewer Part 2 and to make funds available to pay the cost thereof, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of Public Service, Division of Sewerage and Drainage, in that it is necessary to advertise for and open bids and to appropriate funds for the construction of the Truro Relief Sewer Part 2 at the earliest possible time to permit the construction of improvements to provide future relief for the East Main street trunk sewer and trunk sewer service for the City of Columbus areas north of the New York Central Railroad and west of the Big Walnut Creek, thereby preserving and protecting the public health, property and safety; now therefore

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Director of the Department of Public Service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to advertise for and to open bids for

the construction of Truro Relief Sewer, Part 2.

Sec. 2. That, for the purpose of making funds available for the construction of Truro Relief Sewer, Part 2, from the monies now in the fund known as the Sewer Fund and from the monies estimated to come into said fund from any and all sources during the twelve months ending December 31, 1955, there be and is hereby appropriated the sum of \$470,000.00 to the Truro Relief Sewer Part 2 Construction Fund.

Sec. 3. That, for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 83-55—To authorize a modification of contract with J. F. Stephens, Contractor, on Contract No. 3883 and to authorize the appropriation of additional funds to Auditor's Certificate No. 4594 to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, it has now been determined that an extension to the heating system of Fire Engine House No. 11 to include the heating of new oxygen storage building is needed, and

Whereas, J. F. Stephens has proposed, in writing, to furnish and install said extension to the heating system in accordance with plan and specifications for the sum of \$1,227.00, less \$727.00 for omission of insulation on all inside lines above basement for a total price of \$500.00, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Fire, Department of Public Safety in that an extension to the heating system is immediately necessary for the preservation of public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a modification of contract with J. F. AN ORDINANCE No. 84-55—To authorize an additional appropriation to Certificate No. 4656 for the purpose of certifying contract for the purchase of one Circul-Air Hose Drier for use at No. 9 Fire Station, Delaware and Buttles avenues, in the division of Fire, department of public safety.

AN ORDINANCE No. 85-55—To amend the Code of the City of Columbus, Ohio, 1952, Chapter 27, Motor Vehicles and Traffic, Article VI, Left Turns Prohibited, as amended by Ordinance No. 1543-54, passed November 22, 1954, and to repeal said section as so amended.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Code of the City of Columbus, Ohio, 1952, Chapter 27, Motor Vehicles and Traffic, Article VI, Left Turns Prohibited, be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 27.297. Intersections Designated.

The driver of a vehicle is hereby prohibited from making a left turn at the following intersections, under the conditions and during the times herein set forth:

Broad street and Nelson road, while traveling west on Broad street and while traveling north on Nelson road.

Broad street and Sandusky street, while traveling west on Broad street at Sandusky Street.

Front street at any alley intersection between Naghten street and Rich street.

Front street at Gay street.

Front street at Town street.

High street at any alley intersection between Naghten street and Rich street.

High street and Broad street.

High street and Buttles avenue.

High street and Fifth avenue.

High street and First avenue.

High street and Gay street.

High street and Goodale street.

High street and Naghten street.

High street and West Price avenue.

High street and Russell street.

High street and Second avenue.

High street and Spruce street.

High street and West Starr avenue.

High street and State street.

High street and Town street.

Lane avenue and Indianola avenue.

Ludlow street and Town street, while traveling north on Ludlow street and while traveling west on Town street.

Neil avenue and Eleventh avenue, while traveling south on Neil avenue at Eleventh avenue.

Ruhl avenue at James road, while traveling east on Ruhl avenue between the hours 7:00 and 9:00 a. m. and 3:00 and 6:00 p. m..

Sandusky street and River street.

Town street and Fourth street, while traveling east on Town street at Fourth street.

Town street and Third street, while traveling west on Town street at Third street.

Sec. 2. That Section 27.297, Chapter 27, Motor Vehicles and Traffic, Article VI, the Code of the City of Columbus,
