**ORD. No. 772-76**—To grant a variance from the provisions of Section 3235.005 (AR-LD, Apartment Residential-Low Density District) to the C.S.S. Company to permit the following: 1) To erect one (1) sign located on the east side of Kenny Road at Weybridge Road to advertise the "Spaghetti Factory", a proposed restaurant; 2) To permit use of a private drive for commercial vehicular traffic from Kenny Road to land zoned C-4 Commercial developed with the Fox and Hounds Apartment Lounge proposed to be remodeled for a spaghetti restaurant.

Whereas, 1075 Weybridge Road is located in a C-4, Commercial District and is developed as a lounge facility to serve the Fox and Hounds Apartment project; and,

Whereas, the C.S.S. Company proposes to remodel and commercially advertise the lounge as a spaghetti restaurant serving the general public; and,

Whereas, the Zoning Code requires commercial identification signs to be located on commercially zoned land and commercial vehicular access directly from a public street; and,

Whereas, the proposed commercial identification sign and commercial vehicular access will be located on land zoned in the AR-LD, Apartment Residential-Low Density District; and,

Whereas, Sections 3325.005 (AR-LD, Apartment Residential-Low Density District) of the Columbus City Code prevents commercial vehicular traffic and commercial identification signs in the AR-LD, Apartment Residential-Low Density District, and thereby prevents the C.S.S. Company from establishing the proposed spaghetti restaurant and identification sign in compliance with the City Code requirements; now, therefore,

it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

**Section 1.** That the C.S.S. Company, the lessee of the proposed restaurant and commercial vehicular access drive, being more particularly described as follows:

Being situated in the State of Ohio, County of Franklin, City of Columbus, and being a part of Quarter Township I, Township I North, Range 13 West, United States Military Lands, and being a part of a 22.724 acre tract conveyed to Deffert-Fox and Hounds LTD, shown of record in Deed Book 3122, Page 24, Recorder's Office Franklin County, Ohio, and being more particularly described as follows:

Commencing at an iron pin found on the easterly line of Kenny Road at the southwesterly corner of said 22.724 acre tract, and the southeasterly corner of a 0.575 acre tract conveyed to the City of Columbus, Ohio, shown of record in Deed Book 3072, Page 507;

Thence, north along the easterly line of said Kenny Road (easterly line of said 0.575 acre tract), and along the westerly line parallel to and 40.00 feet easterly of line parallel to and 40.00 feet easterly of measured at right angles to the centerline of said Kenny Road, a distance of 364.76 feet to an iron pin at an angle in said line;

Thence, north 0° 15' 31" east, continuing along the easterly line of said Kenny Road (easterly line of said 0.575 acre tract), and along the westerly line of said 22.724 acre tract, and along a line parallel to and 40.00 feet easterly of measured at right angles to the centerline of said Kenny Road, a distance of 84.05 feet to an iron pin, and the true point of beginning of this description;

Thence, north 0° 15' 31" east, continuing along the easterly line of said Kenny Road (easterly line of said 0.575 acre tract), and along the westerly line of said 22.724 acre tract, and along a line parallel to and 40.00 feet westerly of measured at right angles to the centerline of said Kenny Road, a distance of 3.00 feet to an iron pin;

Thence, north 89° 59' 36" east, along a line parallel to the southerly line of said 22.724 acre tract, a distance of 594.28 feet to a point on the westerly line of 0.875 acre tract (zoned C-4);

Thence, south 0° 00' 24" east along the westerly line of a 0.875 acre tract (zoned C-4), a distance of 3.00 feet to a point;

Thence, south 89° 59' 36" west, along a

line parallel to the southerly line of said 22.724 acre tract, a distance of 594.29 feet to the place of beginning, containing 0.0409 acres,

be and hereby is granted a variance from the provisions of Sections 3325.005 (AR-LD, Apartment Residential-Low Density District) of the Columbus City Codes, 1959, insofar as said section prohibits the vehicular commercial traffic access to a business located in a C-4 Commercial District over land zoned Apartment Residential and the erection of a sign associated with the commercial use on land zoned Apartment Residential and therefore prevents the C.S.S. Company from establishing said spaghetti restaurant at 1075 Weybridge Road, subject, however, to the additional conditions listed in this ordinance.

**Section 2.** That this ordinance is conditioned upon and shall be in effect only for so long as: 1) Said property is leased and used by the C.S.S. Company for a spaghetti restaurant known as the Spaghetti Factory; 2) The sign associated with the commercial use conforms to the requirement of Section 3393.152 of the Zoning Code; 3) Any variance to Section 3393.152 shall be by the Graphics Commission; 4) The operation of the Business may be reviewed at any reasonable time by the Division of Planning.

**Section 3.** That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**ORD. No. 809-76**—To vacate the first alley west of Cleveland Avenue, from Strimple Avenue to Kilbourne Avenue.

**ORD. No. 810-76**—To vacate the alley east of Maize Road, from Lenore Avenue to the alley south of Lenore Avenue.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley east of Maize Road, from Lenore Avenue to the alley south of Lenore Avenue, was duly presented to this Council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points named, and

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

**Section 1.** That the alley east of Maize Road, from the south line of Lenore Avenue to the north line of the alley south of Lenore Avenue, be and the same is hereby vacated.

**ORD. No. 811-76**—To vacate the alley east of Sixth Street (Chase Alley), from Chapel to State Streets.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley east of Sixth Street, from Chapel Street to State Street, was duly presented to this Council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points named, and

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

**Section 1.** That the alley east of Sixth Street (Chase Alley), extending from the north line of Chapel Street to the south line of State Street, be and the same is hereby vacated.

**ORD. No. 812-76**—To accept the warranty deed, dated September 11, 1972, from Twenty Fifteen West Fifth, Inc.; to dedicate the premises therein conveyed to public use for roadway purposes; and to name same Reed Road.

Whereas, Ordinance No. 775-72, passed June 5, 1972, authorized the Director of Public Service to enter into an agreement with Twenty Fifteen West Fifth, Inc., to execute a deed to and accept deed from them, in connection with a land trade, and

Whereas, the warranty deed from the company, numbered 26919 and recorded in Volume 3276, Pages 595 and 596, Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio, was never accepted; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

**Section 1.** That the warranty deed, dated September 11, 1972, from Twenty Fifteen West Fifth, Inc., be and the same is hereby accepted and the following real estate be and the same is hereby dedicated to public use for roadway purposes:

Situated in the County of Franklin, in the State of Ohio, and in the City of Columbus, and bounded and described as follows:

Being part of Lot 3, Section 1, Township 1, Range 19, U. S. Military Lands and being a 40 foot wide strip of land along the east side of a 14.0 acre tract of land conveyed to Twenty Fifteen West Fifth, Inc., as the same is recorded in Deed Book 3085, Page 246, Franklin County Recorder's Office, said 40 foot wide strip of land being parallel with and adjacent to the centerline of Reed Road, the said 14.0 acre tract of land being more particularly bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the centerline of Reed Road, said point of beginning being South 2° 52' West 656.6 feet from the point of intersection of the centerline of Reed Road with the centerline of Bethel Road; thence continuing along the centerline of Reed Road South 2° 52' West 334.74 feet to the southeast corner of said 14.0

acre tract; thence with the south line of said 14.0 acre tract North 86° 30' West 1823.20 feet to the southwest corner of said 14.0 acre tract; thence with the west line of said 14.0 acre tract North 3° 20' East 334.74 feet to the northwest corner of said 14.0 acre tract; thence with the north line of said 14.0 acre tract South 86° 30' East 1820.48 feet to the point of beginning.

The area of land to be dedicated for roadway purposes being 0.307 acre, more or less, and right of ingress and egress to be reserved, said 0.307 acre being subject to all easements, exceptions, restrictions, and conditions of record.

Section 2. That the premises so deeded and dedicated be and the same are hereby named Reed Road.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**ORD. No. 813-76**—To authorize and direct the expenditure of \$35,000 from Street Maintenance Repair Fund No. 0265, for the purchase of Traffic Sign Materials under the provisions of the Division of Purchasing's city-wide term contracts, for use by the Division of Traffic Engineering and Parking. (\$35,000)

Whereas, in the usual daily operation of the Division of Traffic Engineering and Parking, Department of Public Safety, it is necessary to purchase the Traffic Sign Materials under the Division of Purchasing's city-wide term contracts for the preservation of the public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the expenditure of \$35,000, or so much thereof that may be necessary, from Street Maintenance and Repair 0265 Fund, Dept. 680, Code 200, for the purchase of the following materials, under the provisions of the Division of Purchasing's city-wide term contracts for the Traffic Sign Materials, is hereby authorized and approved:  
Traffic Sign Materials .....\$35,000

**ORD. No. 815-76**—To provide for salaries and wages for the various classes of positions and to fix working conditions for sworn uniformed officers of the Division of Police of the City of Columbus, Ohio, and to repeal existing Ordinance No. 2076-73, as amended, and to declare an emergency.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Police, Department of Public Safety, City of Columbus, in that it is immediately necessary to provide for salaries and wages for classes of positions in the uniformed ranks of said division and to fix working conditions for such officers and to repeal Ordinance 2076-73, as amended, and for the immediate preservation of public health, property, peace, and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

**Section 1. Short Title**

That this Ordinance shall be known as "The Police Salary Ordinance."

**Section 2. Definitions.**

**Active Service**—being present for the performance of the duties to which an officer of the Division of Police of the City of Columbus has been assigned.

**Appointing Authority**—Director of Public Safety.

**Appointment**—the designation of a person, by due authority, to become an employee in the positions, and his induction into employment in such position.

**Calendar Month**—from the first day to and including the last day of any one of the twelve (12) calendar months.

**Calendar Week**—seven consecutive calendar days starting on Sunday and ending

on Saturday consisting of five scheduled work days and two days off.

**Class**—a group of positions with the same descriptive title having similar duties and responsibilities and requiring similar qualifications and which can be distinguished from other groups of positions.

**Classified Service**—all positions and employment not specifically included by provisions of the City Charter as being in the unclassified service.

**Compensatory Time**—time off with pay for authorized overtime worked in lieu of salary or wages.

**Continuous Service**—service shall be considered continuous for an employee except where interrupted by resignation, retirement, or discharge for cause. However, time off duty due to suspension, leave of absence without pay (except military leave or leave due to injury in line of duty), or lay off due to lack of work or funds shall be deducted in computing service credit. Resignation in order to immediately accept another position in the City service shall not be considered as an interruption of service.

**Demotion**—a change of an officer from a position of one class to a position of a different class having a lower maximum rate of pay.

**Eligible List**—a list of names of persons who have been found qualified, through suitable tests or reinstatement for employment.

**Employee/Employees**—as used in this Ordinance means only those employees in the classified service of the uniformed ranks in the Division of Police. The words employee/employees and officer/officers are synonymous for the purposes of this Ordinance.

**Full-Time Status**—Employment which requires active service to be performed in accordance with an established scheduled working time, such schedule to be based upon not less than eighty (80) hours per fourteen (14) consecutive calendar days for twenty-six (26) consecutive fourteen (14) calendar day pay periods per year.

**Gender**—Every pronoun includes corresponding pronouns of different genders or numbers or both, to the extent the context permits.

**Immediate Family**—spouse, son, daughter, brother, sister, parent, grandchild, grandparent, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, step-father, step-mother, step-sister, step-brother, step-son, step-daughter, half-brother, and half-sister.

**Original Appointment**—initial appointment of a person to a position in the City service, or appointment after service has been interrupted by resignation, retirement or discharge.

**Overtime**—time during which an officer is on duty, working for the City of Columbus in excess of regularly scheduled hours of work as set forth in Section 12, Overtime and Holiday Eligibility and Pay.

Overtime applies only to that time authorized to be worked by the appointing authority in accordance with the provisions of this Ordinance.

**Paid Status**—shall include compensation received for work performed and when on authorized leave with pay.

**Pay Period**—A two calendar week period beginning on a Sunday and ending on the second Saturday thereafter. The pay period is the basis for computation of each officer's pay and accrual of vacation leave and sick leave.

**Pay Plan**—a schedule of compensation rates established for the uniformed positions in the Division of Police.

**Pay Range**—the minimum and maximum pay rates, together with the intermediate rates, if any, established for a class.

**Pay Step**—each of the regular pay steps in a pay range.

**Permanent Status**—the rights and privileges granted to an officer who has been appointed to a classified position after certification from an eligible list or as otherwise provided by the City Charter.

**Position**—any office, employment or job calling for the performance of certain duties and the exercise of certain responsibilities by one individual. A position may be vacant, occupied part-time or occupied full-time.

**Promotion**—a change from a position in one class to a position in a different class having a higher maximum rate of pay.

**Provisional Appointment**—appointment of an individual possessing the minimum qualifications for the position involved, in the absence of and pending the establishment of an eligible list therefore.

**Reappointment**—an appointment from an eligible list of a person whose name has been restored to said list, said person previously having permanent status and separated from the City in good standing.

**Reemployment**—return to duty of a person who is laid off on account of lack of work or lack of funds.

**Resignation**—the voluntary termination of employment of an officer.

**Upgrading**—raising all of the positions by amending the Salary Ordinance to provide a higher pay range.

**Workday**—an eight-hour shift during which an officer is assigned for active duty.

**Workweek**—a regularly recurring period of seven (7) twenty-four (24) hour days consisting of five (5) workdays and two (2) days off unless otherwise provided in this Ordinance.

**Section 3. Police Pay Plan.**

The following pay ranges and hourly rates are hereby established as the "Police Pay Plan" and are to be applied to the several positions as indicated below; said pay ranges shall become effective April 4, 1976, and shall remain in effect through December 25, 1976:
