AN ORDINANCE No. 857-56—Determining to proceed with the improvement of Melva avenue, from Weber road to Abner avenue, in the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Melva avenue, from Weber road to Abner avenue, by grading, draining, constructing combined curb and gutter, Portland cement concrete foundation with asphaltic concrete leveling and surface courses, and doing such other things as may be necessary, in the city of Columbus, Ohio, in accordance with the resolution declaring it necessary to improve the same adopted by council May 7, 1956; and in accordance with the plans, profiles, specifications and estimate of cost therefor approved and now on file in the office of the department of public service.

Sec. 2. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after completion of the proposed improvement, and the city attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Sec. 3. That the whole cost of said improvement, together with interest on notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of bonds and on bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessment to be levied for said improvement and all other necessary expenditures, less one-twentieth thereof, cost of intersections and difference in cost between 32-foot and 26-foot pavement shall be assessed in proportion to the special benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All lots and lands bounding or abutting upon the proposed improvement, which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement and in an amount to be determined.

Sec. 4. That the sum of \$2,550.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the maintenance and repair No. 65-602 fund to pay the remainder of the cost of said improvement.

Sec. 5. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in twenty semi-annual installments with interest on deferred payments at a rate not exceeding six per cent. per annum; provided that the owner of any property assessed may, at his option, pay

such assessment or any number of installments thereof, at any time after said assessment has been levied.

Sec. 6. That notes of the city of Columbus, Ohio, shall be issued in anticipation of the issuance of bonds to be issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments by installments, and in an amount equal thereto.

Sec. 7. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to make and execute contract for the said improvement with the lowest and best bidder after advertising according to law.

Sec. 8. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 859-56—Determining to proceed with the improvement of Croswell road, from Roselea place to Olentangy boulevard; Zeller road, from Westwood road to Croswell road; and Olentangy boulevard, from Westwood road to Ceramic drive, by paving the roadways and constructing sanitary sewer in Croswell road, from Roselea place to Olentangy boulevard, in the city of Columbus, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That it is hereby determined to proceed with the improvement of Croswell road, from Roselea place to Olentangy boulevard; Zeller road, from Westwood road to Croswell road; and Olentangy boulevard, from Westwood road to Ceramic drive, by grading, embanking, draining, constructing combined curb and gutter, Portland cement concrete foundation with asphaltic concrete leveling and surface courses, installing house services (Olentangy boulevard), fire hydrants, and doing such other things as may be necessary, together with the construction of sanitary sewer in Croswell road, from Roselea place to Olentangy boulevard, in the city of Columbus, Ohio, in accordance with the resolution declaring it necessary to improve the same adopted by council May 7, 1956; and in accordance with the plans, profiles, specifications and estimates of cost therefor approved and now on file in the office of the department of public service.

Sec. 2. That the streets herein declared necessary to be improved are so situated in relation to each other that, in order to complete the improvement thereof in the most practical and economical manner, same should be improved at the same time, with the same kind of materials and in the same manner and shall be done under one contract.

Sec. 3. That all claims for damages resulting therefrom shall be judicially inquired into after completion of the proposed improvement, and the city attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to institute proceedings in a court of competent jurisdiction to inquire into such claims.

Sec. 4. That the whole cost of said improvement, together with interest on notes issued in anticipation of the issuance of bonds and on bonds issued in anticipation of the collection of the assessment to be levied for said improvement and all other necessary expenditures, less one-fiftieth thereof and the whole cost of intersections, and the whole cost of constructing the sanitary sewer, less one-fiftieth thereof, shall be assessed in proportion to the special benefits which may result from the improvement upon the following described lots and lands, to-wit: All lots and lands bounding and abutting upon the proposed improvement (except that lots Nos. 17 and 22 of Roselea addition shall be exempt from any assessment for the construction of said sanitary sewer), which said lots and lands are hereby determined to be specially benefited by said improvement; and in an amount to be determined.

Sec. 5. That the sum of \$8,200.00 be and the same is hereby appropriated from the maintenance and repair No. 65-602 fund to pay the remainder of the cost of said improvement.

Sec. 6. That the assessments so to be levied shall be paid in twenty semi-annual installments with interest on deferred payments at a rate not exceeding six per cent. per annum; provided that the owners of any property assessed may, at his option, pay such assessment or any number of installments thereof, at any time after said assessment has been levied.

Sec. 7. That notes of the city of Columbus, Ohio, shall be issued in anticipation of the issuance of bonds to be issued in anticipation of the collection of assessments by installments, and in an amount equal thereto.

Sec. 8. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to make and execute contract for the said improvement with the lowest and best bidder after advertising according to law.
