AN ORDINANCE No. 881-54—To authorize the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, to construct, maintain, repair and operate water mains in the City of Columbus, Ohio, and to approve the plans, specifications and estimated costs therefor, as provided in the Ohio Revised Code 6103.03.

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio propose to construct water mains and appurtenances in Linwood and Studer Avenues south of Frebis Avenue and vicinity, and

Whereas, a portion of said area lies within the City of Columbus and a portion in Franklin County outside of the corporate limits and

Whereas, no City of Columbus, Ohio properties or any properties which lie within the corporate limits of the City of Columbus, Ohio are to be assessed for this improvement, and

Whereas, the plans, specifications and estimated costs were approved February 23, 1954 by the Director of Public Service and the Superintendent, Division of Water, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Water, Department of Public Service, in that it is immediately necessary to permit the construction of water mains and appurtenances in Linwood Avenue and Studer Avenue south of Frebis to provide water service for the properties in this section and for the immediate preservation of public health, peace, property and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the plans, specifications and estimated costs for the improvement known as Water Improvement No. 474, Sewer District Marlon No. 1 designed to provide water service for the area generally south of Frebis Avenue and vicinity, be and they are hereby approved.

Sec. 2. That the Board of County

Commissioners of Franklin County, Ohio, are hereby authorized to proceed with the construction, maintenance, repair and operation of said improvement as provided in Section 6103.03 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Sec. 3. That the City Clerk be and she hereby is directed to transmit three copies of this ordinance to the Board of County Commissioners, Franklin County, Ohio.

Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 882-54—To accept the plat of Dorco Heights.

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the plat of Dorco Heights, being a part of the east one-half of lot No. 7 of the Scioto company survey of a part of quarter township No. 1, range 18, U.S. Military lands, containing 11 acres, more or less, conveyed to George M. Dorco, Jr., by deed of record in deed book 1810, page 191, recorder's office, Franklin county, Ohio, and being a subdivision of lots 5 to 55, inclusive, lying north of Edgemont Gardens No. 2 and east of Maize road, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Sec. 2. That all or parts of the avenues, roads and courts shown thereon and not heretofore dedicated are hereby dedicated to public use as such, and easements are reserved, where indicated on the plat, for public utility purposes above and beneath the surface of the ground.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 883-54—To vacate the alley west of Kingsbury place, from the north line of the first alley north of Livingston avenue northwardly and eastwardly to the west line of Kingsbury place.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley west of Kingsbury place, from the north line of the first alley north of Livingston avenue northwardly and eastwardly to the west line of Kingsbury place, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points named, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley west of Kingsbury place, from the north line of the first alley north of Livingston avenue northwardly and eastwardly to the west line of Kingsbury place, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley hereby vacated, and does further reserve unto itself an easement for the full width of the alley for the purpose of installing or constructing any new utility facilities, either publicly or privately owned, which may become necessary, and shall

have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of constructing, installing, replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 884-54—To authorize and direct the director of public service to enter into contract with the Allis-Chalmers Manufacturing Company for inspecting and repairing the 12,500 K.W. Turbine-Generator Unit, Serial Nos. 150657 and 10489 of the division of electricity and to appropriate the money therefor.

Whereas, the Allis-Chalmers Manufacturing Company, being the manufacturer of the aforesaid turbine-generator unit, is the only company thoroughly equipped and capable of furnishing the necessary service, repair parts, and materials necessary to perform the aforesaid work, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Division of Electricity, Department of Public Service, in that it is necessary to inspect and repair the aforesaid turbine-generator unit without delay for the immediate preservation of public health, peace, property and safety, now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the Director of Public Service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into contract with the Allis-Chalmers Manufacturing Company, without advertising for bids, for skilled service men, repair parts, and materials, as may be necessary to inspect and repair the 12,500 K.W. Allis-Chalmers Turbine-Generator Unit, Serial Nos. 150657 and 10489, respectively, of the Division of Electricity to restore said unit to the most satisfactory operating condition attainable.

Sec. 2. That the rates and amounts to be paid for said inspection and repair work shall not exceed the following:

- (A) For the time worked by each skilled serviceman between 7 A.M. and 6 P.M., Monday to Friday, inclusive, \$6.00 per hour, provided however that any time worked in excess of 8 hours, or any time worked outside of the aforesaid period, or any time worked on Saturday, shall be paid at the rate of \$9.00 per hour; furthermore, all time worked on Sunday and Holidays shall be payable at the rate of \$12.00 per hour.
- (B) The Contractor shall be reimbursed for the actual cost of traveling expenses, living expenses and other associated expenses incidental to the furnishing of the aforesaid service men.
- (C) Any repair parts, materials, special equipment, etc., required are to be payable at the contractors regularly established prices for such items.

Sec. 3. That for the purpose of paying the cost of inspecting and repairing the aforesaid turbine-generator unit there be and hereby is appropriated from the Division of Electricity Fund No. 82, Code 300, Other Maintenance of Equipment Expense, the sum of \$2,000.00 or so much thereof, as may be necessary.

Sec. 4. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.
