AN ORDINANCE No. 883-61—To vacate all right-of-way within the Goodale Project Vacation Plan No. 1, being Collins Avenue, Poplar Avenue, Alley west of Pennsylvania Avenue, Alley south of Buttles Avenue and Alley north of Poplar Avenue, between specified limits.

Whereas, the Urban Renewal Commission has requested necessary steps be taken to vacate all right-of-way within the Goodale Project Vacation Plan No. 1, and

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacations as requested, that they will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following streets and alleys within the Goodale Project Vacation Plan No. 1 be and the same are hereby vacated:

Collins Avenue—Being all of Collins Avenue, extending from the west line of Pennsylvania Avenue to the east line of Michigan Avenue.

Poplar Avenue—Being all of Poplar Avenue, extending from the west line of Pennsylvania Avenue to the

easterly right-of-way line of the Michigan Avenue relocation, shown upon the plans of the Goodale Expressway of the Columbus Expressway System, on file in the Office of the Chief Engineer, City of Columbus, Ohio, thence continuing on to a line parallel to and 30.0 feet to the right of the survey line marking the center line of said Michigan Avenue relocation, as shown upon said Goodale Expressway Plans.

Alley west of Pennsylvania Avenue—Being all of the alley west of Pennsylvania Avenue, extending from the south line of Buttles Avenue to the north line of Collins Avenue, thence from the south line of Collins Avenue to the north line of Poplar Avenue, thence from the south line of Poplar Avenue to a line 30.0 feet to the right of and parallel to the survey line marking the center line of said Michigan Avenue relocation, as shown upon said Goodale Expressway Plans.

Alley south of Buttles Avenue—Being all of the alley south of Buttles Avenue, extending from the west line of Pennsylvania Avenue to the east line of the alley west of Pennsylvania Avenue, and from the west line of the alley west of Pennsylvania Avenue to the east line of Michigan Avenue.

Alley north of Poplar Avenue—Being all of the alley north of Poplar Avenue, extending from the west line of Pennsylvania Avenue to the east line of the alley west of Pennsylvania Avenue.

Sec. 2. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the Mayor. Passed July 17, 1961.

AN ORDINANCE No. 884-61—To vacate Spring Street, Ninth Street, the first alley west of Ninth Street and the second alley west of Ninth Street, between specified limits.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon Spring Street, Ninth Street, the first alley west of Ninth Street and the second alley west of Ninth Street, between specified points, was duly presented to this Council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said streets and alleys, between the limits specified, and

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacations as prayed for in said petition, that they will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore, Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus:

Section 1. That Spring Street, from the east line of Cleveland Avenue to the west line of Ninth Street; and Ninth Street, from the south line of Spring Street westward to a line extending from a point marking the southeast corner of Ninth Street and Spring Street eastward to a point in the west line of Ninth Street, which is 38.89 feet north of the north line of Spring Street westward be and the same are hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That Ninth Street, from the north line of the first alley south of Spring Street to the south line of Spring Street; the first alley west of Ninth Street, from the south line of Spring Street to its south terminus; and the second alley west of Ninth Street, from the south line of Spring Street to the north line of Lot No. 1 of John C. Bullitts 8th Street Addition, be and the same are hereby vacated.

Sec. 3. That the vacation of the street and alleys described in Section 2 of this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest

period allowed by law; and the vacation of the streets described in Section 1 shall take effect and be in force upon the completion and acceptance, by the City of Columbus, of the proposed four lane pavement in relocated Spring Street.

Sec. 4. That the City of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewer, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the City, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said streets and alleys hereby vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

Sec. 5. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
