AN ORDINANCE No. 882-41—To provide funds for the use of department No. 43, subdivision of public charities, division of public welfare, department of public safety, and to repeal Ordinance No. 837-41, passed December 15, 1941.

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the subdivision of public charities, division of public welfare, department of public safety, in that it is necessary to provide funds for the operation of said subdivision for the immediate preservation of public peace, health, and safety, now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. AN ORDINANCE No. 886-41—To authorize contracts for chemicals in the division of water, department of public service.

Whereas, council by ordinance No. 747-41 passed November 3, 1941, authorized the board of purchase to advertise and open bids for chemicals for the division of water, department of public service; and,

Whereas, the board of purchase, pursuant to this authority, advertised and opened bids for chemicals on December 11, 1941; and,

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of water, department of public service, in that it is necessary that new contracts be entered into at once in order that the supply of chemicals may not be interrupted for the immediate preservation of public health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the board of purchase be and it is hereby directed and authorized to award contracts for lime and soda ash for the division of water according to law.

Sec. 2. That the money necessary to purchase lime and soda ash for the division of water, be, and the same is hereby appropriated from code B-9 fund No. 90, in the following amounts:

AN ORDINANCE No. 887-41—To authorize the extension of contract number 241 with Geis Construction company and to appropriate additional funds to pay the cost thereof.

Whereas, pursuant to ordinance number 712-41, passed October 20, 1941, the director of public service entered into contract with Geis Construction company for the construction of a concrete floor in a portion of the city owned property on Short street known as the west barn, and

Whereas, it is desirable to extend said contract to cover the entire floor area, and
