

**AN ORDINANCE No. 906-51**—To make additional appropriation to funds A-1 supervision, A-2 clerk hire and labor, C-12 utilities, D-1 pensions, 602 outlay of fixed assets, in the division of water, department of public service.

Whereas, the expenditures in the above funds exceeds previous estimates and appropriations; and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the division of water, department of public service in that it is immediately necessary to provide additional funds to pay salaries and pensions; also to provide funds for utility charges, and the purchase of material and equipment for the balance of the year 1951; now, therefore

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That from surplus money in the division of water, department of public service, fund No. 90, and from any and all moneys to come into said fund through December 31, 1951, there be and there is hereby appropriated the following sums:

- A-1—\$1,272.00—Supervision
- A-2—\$210,000.00—Clerk hire and labor
- C-12—\$10,000.00—Utilities
- D-1—\$7,000.00—Pensions
- 602—\$10,000.00—Outlay of fixed assets

Sec. 2. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto which is made a part hereof this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

**AN ORDINANCE No. 907-51**—To appropriate additional moneys to pay the city's portion of the cost of certain street improvements.

Whereas, upon compiling the final costs for the improvement of the alley north Blake avenue, from East avenue to the alley west of Findley avenue, and Clinton street, from the alley west of Findley avenue to Findley avenue; alley west of Champion avenue, from Gates street to Frebis avenue; Dale avenue, from James road to Hampton road; alley west of Garfield avenue, from the alley north of Mt. Vernon avenue to Buckingham street, and the alley north of Mt. Vernon avenue, from St. Clair avenue to Garfield avenue; and Oak street, from Fourth street to Grant avenue, it has been learned that the city's share of such costs exceeds the monies appropriated and additional funds should be made available; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following sums of money be and they are hereby appropriated from the street improvement and intersection fund No. 89 for the street improvement funds listed, for the purpose of paying the city's portion of the cost of making such improvements:

**AN ORDINANCE No. 908-51**—To appropriate additional moneys to pay the cost of the city portion of certain street improvements.

Whereas, upon compiling the final costs for the improvement of Azelda street, Weber road to the north lot line of the alley north of Weldon avenue; Bulen avenue, Whittier street to Reinhard avenue; and Oakley avenue, south line reserves A & B of Westland addition to the alley south of Safford avenue, it has been learned that the city's share of such costs exceeds the monies appropriated and additional funds should be made available; now, therefore,

Section 1. That the following named persons appointed by this council as members of board of revision to hear all objections to the estimated assessments for the following proposed improvements:

**AN ORDINANCE No. 910-51**—To vacate a portion of McAllister avenue, from the east line of James road to the west line of a 20-foot alley, and from the east line of said 20-foot alley to the west line of Ashburton road.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon McAllister avenue, from the east line of James road to the west line of a 20-foot alley, and from the east line of said 20-foot alley to the west line of Ashburton road, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said street, between the limits named, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That a portion of McAllister avenue, from the east line of James road to the west line of a 20-foot alley, and from the east line of said 20-foot alley to the west line of Ashburton road, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said street hereby vacated, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of operating, replacing and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

**AN ORDINANCE No. 911-51**—To authorize the director of public service to execute a lease agreement, with the Columbus Zoological Society for the operation and maintenance of the city-owned miniature railroad at the Columbus Zoo.

Whereas, the Columbus Zoological Society, a non-profit organization, is largely responsible for the inception and existence of the Columbus Municipal Zoo, and

Whereas, said society uses the funds available to it for the furtherance and betterment of said zoo, and

Whereas, due to municipal and state regulations covering the acceptance, distribution and use of funds by the city of Columbus, the auditing of the accounts is extremely difficult, and

Whereas, the Columbus Zoological Society is in a better position to collect fares, operate and maintain the miniature railroad at the Columbus municipal zoo, and

Whereas, it is the sense of this council that the operation of said miniature railroad should be placed in the hands of the Columbus Zoological Society, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in the department of public service, in that the right and privilege to operate and maintain the miniature railroad at the Columbus municipal zoo should be leased to the Columbus Zoological Society, in order to protect the public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the director of public service be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a lease agreement with the Columbus Zoological Society, covering the operation and maintenance of the city-owned miniature railroad, trackage, and facilities at the municipal zoo by said society, subject to the following conditions:
