Section 1. That the plat of Yorkshire East, Section No. 1, being a subdivision situated in the County of Franklin, State of Ohio, City of Columbus, and being a part of Half Section 22 of Section 14 of Township 12, Range 21, Refugee Lands, containing 22.74 acres of the 123,346 acre tract conveyed to "The Huntington National Bank of Columbus, Trustee" by deed of record in Deed Book 2220, Page 96 (correcting deed of record in Deed Book 2121, Page 209), Recorder's Office, Franklin County, Ohio, and being a subdivision lying north of Livingston Avenue and west of McNaughten Road, be and the same is hereby accepted.
