Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon Chapel Street, extending from Starling Street to a point 24 feet west of the east line of Lot 131 of Sullivan's Western Addition, was duly presented to this Council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said street, between the points named, and agreeing, in lieu of such vacation, to deed to the City of Columbus a tract of land 24 feet in width off the east line of Inlot 131, running from Chapel Street north to State Street, to be dedicated to public use for alley purposes and to pave same at no cost to the City and

Whereas, Council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore
