Council Routine.

ORDINANCES INTRODUCED.

To pay bills and claims against the following funds: Germania street sewer \$791.84, general expense \$329.73, High street viaduct \$91.85, general expense \$81, waterworks \$427.25, sanitary \$946.50, fire \$487.93, police \$166.49, sewers and drainage \$60.50, street repair \$21, street cleaning \$17.15, City hall \$88.15, general expense \$226.12.

ORDINANCES PASSED.

To pay bills and claims against the following funds: Fire, \$8800; same, \$290.57; general expense, \$5118.29; same, \$325; same, \$29; same, \$10; workhouse, \$150; same, \$3075; waterworks, \$3309.29; police, \$231.89; street cleaning, \$99.08; sanitary, \$23.60; City park, \$145.73; Goodale park, \$345; street repair, \$148.25; poor, \$102.25; City hall, \$224; gas and light, \$5425; High street viaduct, \$2214.76; Sewer District No. 3, \$60; library, \$301.80; sewers and drainage, \$224.75. Other ordinances passed were as follows: Accepting Stone's Broad street and Woodland avenue subdivision; to vacate Park street; to vacate a portion of Medary avenue; to pay salaries of councilmen for the month of January; accepting Sherwood & Huling's subdivision.

RESOLUTIONS ADOPTED.

Declaring the necessity of improving Hanford street from High to Parsons avenue and Jefferson avenue from Buckingham street to Leonard avenue; authorizing the county auditor and treasurer to give Frank Hartung credit for \$383.57 in full satisfaction of his claim for damages occurring from changing grade of West Mound street; authorizing all unlettered street corners to be relettered designating names of streets; appointing Horace McClaren, Shode Miller and Edgar M. Leach as viewers of the Hayden avenue improvement; appointing Samuel B. Campbell, T. C. Maxwell and O. P. Baker viewers of the Hamilton avenue improvement; authorizing the mayor and director of accounts to borrow \$8351 to defray the cost and expense of extending Hamilton avenue.

AN ORDINANCE, No. 9767. To vacate a portion of Medary avenue. Whereas, A petition signed by the owners of lots abutting on or in the immediate vicinity of the street hereinafter described has been presented to the Council praying for the vacation of the same; and Whereas, Notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition has been given by publishing the same in the Daily Ohio State Journal, a

newspaper of general circulation in the corporation for six consecutive weeks, ending on the 3d day of January, 1895; and

Whereas, The Council is satisfied there is good cause for such vacation that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and that the same should be made; therefore,

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the Council of the City of Columbus, Ohio, That 22 1/2 feet of Medary avenue from Clinton avenue to the Mock road be vacated by taking off 11 feet and 3 inches from each side of said avenue.

SEC. 2. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication according to law. Passed January 28, 1895.

AN ORDINANCE, No. 9811. To vacate a part of Park street therein described.

Whereas, On the 26th day of November, 1894, a petition for the vacation of Park street from the north end of the Park street bridge to the north line of Maple street was presented to this council by certain owners of real estate in the immediate vicinity thereof, notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition has been given according to law; and

Whereas, Upon the hearing thereof this council is satisfied that there is just cause for such vacation and finds that the same will not be detrimental to the general interest; therefore,

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus, Ohio, That Park street from the north end of the Park street bridge south to the north line of Maple street be and the same is hereby vacated.

SEC. 2. That this ordinance take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication according to law. Passed January 28, 1895.

AN ORDINANCE, No. 9842, Accepting John Stone's Broad street and Woodland avenue subdivision.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained by the City Council of the city of Columbus, That John Stone's Broad street and Woodland avenue subdivision be and the same is hereby approved and accepted. Streets and alleys as shown on his plat of subdivision not heretofore dedicated are hereby declared public highways of said city.

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication according to law. Passed January 28, 1895.

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the city of Columbus, Ohio, That it is necessary to improve Souder avenue from Broad street to Town street by grading and constructing thereon a macadam roadway, setting a 5-inch curb of Berea, Fulton, Sunbury or Iberia stone, and grading and paving the gutters with boulders or hard-burned or vitrified brick or block, according to plan "A" on file in the office of the chief engineer, and in accordance with the plat, plan and profile thereof, and specifications, reported to the Board of Public Works by the chief engineer of said city on the 22d day of September, 1894, and now

on file in the said engineer's office; and that said improvement be made under and according to an act of the general assembly of the State of Ohio, passed March 14, 1893, and entitled "An act to provide for the improvement of streets, avenues and alleys in cities of the first grade of the second class."

RESOLVED, by the City Council of the city of Columbus, Ohio, That it is necessary to improve Jefferson avenue from Buckingham street to Leonard avenue by grading and constructing thereon an asphalt, stone block, Hayden block, Hallwood block, East Clayton block, Parto block, fire-clay or hard-burned brick pavement, and setting a 5-inch curb of Berea, Fulton, Sunbury or Iberia stone, in accordance with the plat, plan and profile thereof reported to said Board of Public Works by the chief engineer of said city on the 17th day of December, 1894, and now on file in said engineer's office; and that said improvement be made under and according to an act of the general assembly of the State of Ohio, passed March 14, 1893, and entitled "An act to provide for the improvement of streets, avenues and alleys in cities of the first grade of the second class."
