

Recorder's office, and extending westwardly from the C. & O. railroad and southwardly from a point south of Highland drive, be and the same is hereby accepted.

Sec. 2. That all or parts of the avenues and roads shown thereon and not heretofore dedicated are hereby dedicated to public use as such, and easements shown on the plat are for the construction, operation and maintenance of public utilities and, where necessary, are for the construction, operation and maintenance of service connections to adjacent lots.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 997-56—To vacate the alley west of Joyce avenue, extending from Arlington avenue to the alley north of Arlington avenue.

Whereas, petition, signed by the owners of all lots and lands abutting upon the alley west of Joyce avenue, from Arlington avenue to the alley north of Arlington avenue, was duly presented to this council, praying for and consenting to the vacation of said alley, between the points named, and

Whereas, council, upon hearing, is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for in said petition, that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the alley west of Joyce avenue, extending from the north line of Arlington avenue to the south line of the alley north of Arlington avenue, be and the same is hereby vacated.

Sec. 2. That the city of Columbus reserves the right to operate and maintain any and all sewers, water lines and any other public utilities owned by the city, and that the right is reserved to operate and maintain any other public utilities, if any, now existing on or in said alley hereby vacated, and does further reserve unto itself perpetual easement for the full width of the alley for the purpose of installing or constructing any new utility facilities, either publicly or privately owned, which may become necessary, and shall have the right to enter thereon at any time for the purpose of constructing, installing, replacing, operating and maintaining the same.

Sec. 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

AN ORDINANCE No. 998-56—To vacate portions of certain streets and an alley, presently within the area of the Mound street extension of the Columbus expressway system.

Whereas, the city of Columbus now has title to certain parcels of real estate abutting streets and an alley, which are necessary to be vacated in order to accommodate the construction of the Mound street extension of the Columbus expressway system, and

Whereas, an emergency exists in that such vacations are immediately necessary in order that the construction work on said Mound street extension may proceed without delay, thereby preserving the public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the following portions of the streets and an alley, here-

inafter described, be and the same are hereby vacated:

Canal street, from the north line of Fulton street to the south line of Mound street;

Jewett street, from the north line of Fulton street to the south line of Mound street;

Second street, from the north line of Mound street to a point 70 feet south of the south line of Engler street, on the west line of said Second street, and 72.50 feet south of the south line of Engler street, on the east line of said Second street;

Second street, from a point 31.25 feet north of the north line of Engler street to the south line of Mound street; Ludlow street,

from the north line of Fulton street to a point 93.75 feet south of the south line of Engler street; Ludlow street,

from a point 31.25 feet south of the south line of Mound street to the south line of Mound street; Cardington alley,

from the east line of Canal street to the west line of Jewett street; Engler street,

from the east line of Canal street to the west line of Second street.

Sec. 2. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 999-56—To authorize the City Attorney to enter into a contract with William A. Allen for the negotiation of properties necessary for the Goodale Link of the Expressway Project.

Whereas, the city has agreed to participate in the construction of the Goodale Link of the Expressway Project; and,

Whereas, the city has agreed to perform the necessary work in connection with the purchase of right-of-way for said project; and,

Whereas, due to the size of this project and the time involved, it is necessary to enter into a contract for an additional negotiator to negotiate for the purchase of the property for said project; and,

Whereas, bonds have been issued and funds are available in General Expressways Fund No. 1 to pay for the services of such a negotiator; and,

Whereas, such services are of a professional and non-competitive nature; and,

Whereas, an emergency exists in the usual daily operation of the Department of the City Attorney in that it is immediately necessary to engage the services of a negotiator to expedite the construction of the Goodale Link of the Expressway Project, and for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That the City Attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to enter into a contract with William A. Allen for the negotiation of properties necessary for the Goodale Link of the Expressway Project subject to the approval of the Department of Highways, State of Ohio, for the expenditures under such contract in order that the same will be eligible for federal and state participation. The compensation to be paid for such services shall be at the rate of \$3.00 per hour.

Sec. 2. That the sum of \$3,000.00 or so much thereof as may be necessary be and the same is hereby appropriated

from General Expressways Fund No. 1 for the purpose of paying for said negotiation services which shall be paid by the vouchers approved by the City Attorney. Said vouchers shall be supported by a statement setting forth the hours and services performed each day.

Sec. 3. That for the reasons stated in the preamble hereto, which is hereby made a part hereof, this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.

AN ORDINANCE No. 1002-56—To provide for the issuance of bonds in the sum of \$100,000.00, being the second installment of \$2,000,000.00 bonds authorized by the electorate at the November 2, 1954 election, for the purpose of paying the city's portion of the cost of eliminating grade crossings within the city of Columbus, Ohio, including the acquisition of real estate or easements or other interests in real estate in the city of Columbus.

Whereas, on July 26, 1954, the city council adopted a resolution declaring the necessity of issuing bonds in the sum of \$2,000,000.00 for the purpose of paying the city's portion of the cost of eliminating grade crossings within the city of Columbus, Ohio, including the acquisition of real estate or easements or other interests in real estate; to submit the question of issuing said bonds to a vote of the people and providing for the levying of taxes outside the ten-mill limitation prescribed by law at a regular election to be held on the second day of November, 1954, and

Whereas, at said regular election held on the second day of November, 1954, more than fifty-five percent (55%) of those voting upon the question of issuing bonds in the city of Columbus, Ohio, for said purposes voted in favor thereof, and

Whereas, the city auditor has issued his certificate as to the estimated life of usefulness of interests in real estate and the construction of grade crossing elimination facilities hereinafter referred to as exceeding 5 years, and has further certified the maximum maturity of such bonds as being subject to limitation as to maturities as fixed by council in the resolution submitting the question of issuing such bonds to a vote of the people (adopted July 26, 1954), and

Whereas, an emergency exists in that it is necessary to issue and sell said bonds for the purpose of paying the city's portion of the cost of constructing said grade crossing elimination facilities and for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety; now, therefore,

Be it ordained by the council of the city of Columbus:

Section 1. That it is declared necessary to issue bonds of the city of Columbus, Ohio, in the principal sum of \$2,000,000.00 in order to provide a fund for the purpose of paying the city's share of the cost of grade crossing elimination projects consisting of the construction of underpasses and/or overpasses; widening, opening, extending or changing the lines of streets, roads or alleys; the acquisition of real estate or easements or other interests in real estate necessary therefor and including the necessary engineering, legal and administrative work, advertising and printing of said bonds, together with other work incidental thereto, and that said bonds shall be issued in installments and that there shall be presently issued the second installment of said bonds in the sum of \$100,000.00 and that notes shall not be issued in anticipation of the issuance of said second installment.

Sec. 2. That said bonds shall be signed by the mayor and the auditor and
