ORDINANCE NO. 857

**AN ORDINANCE TO CHANGE THE NAME OF
AN EXISTING STREET WITHIN THE VILLAGE TO PIONEERS COURT
AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY**

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Riverlea has received the petition of Charles A. Takos and Carolyn M. Takos, residents of the Village who are the owners of Lots 64 and 65 in the Van de Boe-Hagers Company Addition No. 11, also known as Riverlea, which lots are located within the municipal boundaries of the Village of Riverlea, by which the petitioners request that the legislative authority of the Village change the name of the street on which such lots abut to "Pioneers Court";

WHEREAS, the original plat of the subdivision that became the Village of Riverlea described such street as "Pioneers' Street", and the legislative authority of the Village by its Ordinance Number 2 accepted such street as "Pioneers Street"; but each other street within the Village that runs in a generally north-south direction has been denominated a "Court", the street signs posted along this street describe it as "Pioneers Court", and the street is generally known by residents of the Village as "Pioneers Court";

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the Village has received a request from the Franklin County Engineer for a clarification of the correct name of the street, and the Council of the Village has received the recommendation of the Streets Commissioner of the Village that the name of the street be changed to "Pioneers Court";

WHEREAS, Ohio Revised Code Section 723.05 permits the legislative authority of a municipal corporation, on petition by a person owning a lot in the municipal corporation praying that a street or alley in the immediate vicinity of such lot be vacated, or narrowed or the name thereof changed, upon hearing, and being satisfied that there is good cause for such change of name, vacation or narrowing, that it will not be detrimental to the general interest, and that it should be made, may, by ordinance, declare such street or alley vacated, narrowed or the name thereof changed; and

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Riverlea having conducted a hearing on the petition and the proposed name change at its regular meeting of Council held September 19, 2005, and having determined that it has received a petition from persons who own a lot within the municipal corporation and in the immediate vicinity of such street; and that good cause exists for such change of name, and that such change of name shall not be detrimental to the general interest, and that such change of name should be made.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF RIVERLEA, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. CHANGE OF STREET NAME. That the name of all that part of Pioneers Street within the Village, from the northern boundary of the Village to the southern boundary thereof, is hereby changed to "Pioneers Court". Nothing in this ordinance is intended to alter or enlarge any rights the Village or the public generally may have in those parts of Pioneers Court (previously Pioneers Street) that have been vacated previously.

Section 2. NOTICE TO AFFECTED ENTITIES. That the Mayor or her designee is hereby directed and authorized to deliver copies of this Ordinance to the following persons or entities: The Franklin County Engineer; The Board of Trustees of Sharon Township; the Office of the City Manager of the City of Worthington; the Worthington Police Department; the Worthington Fire Department; and the Franklin County Sheriff.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. That this Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and for the further reason that it is urgently necessary to preserve and protect the safety and property of the residents of the Village of Riverlea. Such emergency exists in the need to provide immediate notice to entities that provide emergency services to residents along the street that is the subject of this Ordinance and to prevent the possibility of confusion in the location addresses of such residents.

WHEREFORE, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage.


Section 4. OPEN MEETINGS. This Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with law.

Section 5. PUBLICATION. That pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 731.25, the Council of the Village of Riverlea hereby determines that publication of this Ordinance in a newspaper is unnecessary and does hereby determine that this Ordinance shall be published by posting copies hereof in the five following places which are determined to be the five most public places in the Village of Riverlea, Ohio:

1. The Circle on West Riverglen Drive.
2. The Ravine Park on West Riverglen Drive.
3. The Northwest corner of Beverly Place and Dover Court.
4. Lot 75 on West Riverglen Drive.
5. Lot 7 on West Southington Avenue.


Copies of this Ordinance shall be posted continuously in the above-mentioned places for a period of fifteen (15) days and at the expiration thereof this Ordinance shall become effective.
