West Street, from Main Street to North Corporation line	11¢
State Street, from south end of paved street to South Corporation line	21¢

SECTION 2. That said assessment shall be due and payable at the office of the Village Treasurer within fifty (50) days from and after the passage of this Ordinance, after which time said assessments remaining unpaid shall be certified to the County Auditor to be by him placed on the tax duplicate for collection in the manner provided by law. Said assessment when collected shall be placed to the credit of the ^{first} State Sprinkling and Cleaning Fund.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
