

ORDINANCE NO. 611.-27

TO VACATE STREET OR ALLEY KNOWN AS  
PLUM STREET FROM THE EAST LINE OF  
STATE STREET EASTWARDLY TO THE C.A.  
& C. RAILROAD RIGHT OF WAY.

WHEREAS, on the 15th day of August, 1927 a petition by persons owning lots and property in the immediate vicinity of Plum Street from the east line of State Street eastwardly to the C. A. and C. Railroad right of way was duly presented to Council praying that said street or alley between the points named be vacated; and notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition has been given as required by law by publication in the Public Opinion, a newspaper of general circulation in the corporation for six consecutive weeks ending on October 27th, 1927, and,

WHEREAS, Council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for; that it will not be detrimental to the general interests, and ought to be made.

NOW THEREFORE, Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Westerville, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1. That Plum Street or alley from the east side of State Street eastwardly to the C. A. and C. Railroad right of way be and the same is hereby vacated.

SECTION 2. The clerk is hereby ordered and directed to certify a copy of this ordinance to the Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance be and remain in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
