

An Ordinance,

No. 63.

Entitled, An Ordinance to vacate a part of east main street.
 Section 1. Be it ordained by the Incorporated Village of Westerville, that so much of East Main Street in said Village as lies between Vine Street and the first alley east thereof at its intersection of east College Avenue up to the curbing and pavement on the north side of said Main Street and not to include or interfere with the same as they now exist, be and the same is hereby declared vacated for street purposes.

Section 2. This ordinance to take effect and be in force within ten days from and after its passage and publication as required by law.

An Ordinance,

No. 64.

Entitled, An ordinance to purchase and dedicate a certain tract of ground (described therein) for the purpose of a public park.

Whereas: a petition has been presented to the Council of the Incorporated Village of Westerville, signed by a large number of citizens and taxpayers resident therein, praying that the small strip of ground lying east of Vine Street between East College Avenue and East Main Street, and extending eastward to the intersection of said streets at the crossing of the first alley east of said Vine Street, be purchased, at private sale from the owner and that portion of east main street which extends from said Vine Street to said alley at its intersection with east College Avenue, except so much thereof as is now occupied by the pavement and curbing on the north side thereof, be vacated, and that the strip of land so to be purchased, together with the part of east main street so to be vacated, be improved and dedicated to the public, for the purpose of a public park, and

Whereas: notice of the filing of said petition, and the prayer thereof was duly given for six consecutive weeks, and

Whereas: In the judgement of the said Council it was deemed proper that the prayer of said ^{petition} be granted, and

Whereas: the said Council ^{in pursuance} thereof, has passed an Ordinance, vacating said portion of said east main street, and has purchased from the owner, at private sale, said tract of ground lying adjacent thereto, for the purposes hereinafter stated, for the reasonable sum of one hundred dollars. Now, therefore, Be it Ordained, by the Incorporated Village of Westerville, Ohio,

Section 1. That the sum of one hundred dollars, be, and the same is hereby appropriated, out of the general fund, now in the Treasury of said Corporation, to pay the purchase price of said tract of ground, and

Section 2. That the tract of ground so purchased, and the portion of said East Main Street, so vacated, and lying adjacent thereto, be suitably improved, and that the same be and hereby is, dedicated, as and for the uses and purposes of a public park,

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect, and be in force from and after ten days from the date of its publication.
