

TO VACATE CERTAIN STREETS AND ALLEYS IN THE WALNUT PARK ADDITION, VILLAGE OF WESTERVILLE, OHIO.

WHEREAS, on the 28th day of August, 1950, a petition by persons owning lots and property in the immediate vicinity and adjacent to certain streets and alleys in the Walnut Park Addition as hereinafter set forth, was duly presented to Council praying that said streets and alleys named be vacated and notice of the pendency and prayer of said petition has been given as required by law by publication in the Public Opinion, a newspaper of general circulation in the Corporation, for six consecutive weeks ending on January 4, 1951, and,

WHEREAS, Council upon hearing is satisfied that there is good cause for such vacation as prayed for; that it will not be detrimental to the general interests and ought to be made,

NOW WHEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF WESTERVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That,

- (1) Weyant Street from Park Street to Walnut Street,
- (2) Plum Street from a line connecting the Southwest corner of lot #18 and Northwest corner of lot #35, eastward to a line connecting the Northeast corner of lot #45 and the Southeast corner of lot #28,
- (3) An alley from a line connecting the Southeast corner of lot #46 and Northeast corner of lot #58 to a line connecting the Southwest corner of lot #35 and the Northwest corner of lot #57, Walnut Park Addition,
- (4) An alley beginning at a line connecting the Southeast corner of lot #17 and the Northeast corner of lot #34 westward to a line connecting the Southwest corner of lot #7 and the Northwest corner of lot #24,

be and the same are vacated.

Section 2. That the Village of Westerville hereby reserves all rights, privileges and easements for the purpose of construction and maintenance of public utilities over, upon and under said streets and alleys.

Section 3. The Clerk is hereby ordered and directed to certify a copy of this ordinance to the Auditor of Franklin County, Ohio.

Section 4. That this ordinance be and remain in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
