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DECEMBER 23, 1809

Whereas a petition for a road was handed in, praying for a Road leading from Franklinton to the County line of Fairfield, it is ordered that the petition be granted and a Road Laid out on the best ground- that the nature of the case will admit of to intersect a road leading from Lancaster to Franklinton and it is ordered that Lyne Sterling, Joseph Grate and James Hogue be Viewers of said Road, and Joseph Vance be surveyer of the same by order of the Board of Commissioners.

March 1, 1810.

Ordered that the prayers of the petitioners for a Road leading from Franklinton to intersect the Road leading from Lancaster to Delaware be granted be as follows

Vis Beginning at Franklinton southeast to the ferry from thence to the northwest corner of John McGonas tract of land from thence a due east corners between the second and third range of sections in the Refugee tract to the County line of Fairfield, where it will intersect a Road leaving from Lancaster to Delaware Town William White, William Runyan, Abraham Deardurff be and are appointed as Viewers of said Road and Joseph Vance surveyer of said Road by order of the Board.

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(LIVINGSTON AVE.)

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A Road from Franklinton east to Fairfield County line.

Whereas the Board of Commissioners have heretofore to wit, on the first day of March 1810 made their order for a View and survey of the above Road, and the Viewers and surveyer afterwards proceeded to make the same as will appear from the following return. To which John McGown made objection, by petition, for damages and afterwards were appointed five landholders to assess the damages whereupon the Landholders made their return that the said John McGown is not entitled to any damages in consequence of the said Road being open.

Therefore no further objections being made to said Road, it is ordered to be recorded.

RETURN. To the Board of Commissioners:

Gentlemen, We have in obedience to your order for laying out a Road from the fording of Scioto river on the Road leading to Chillicothe, on an east direction to Alum Creek then to Fairfield County line crossing upper Walnut Creek on the best direction where the ground would admit until it would intersect the said County line. Also we have erected Conspicuous monuments at proper places to designate the miles and have herewith annexed a plat thereof together with the courses and distances for your inspection. We also do certify that it will be a road of great importance and Utility to the Citizens of its vicinity, as well as to the public. Given under our hands as Viewers of the said Road this 4th day of April 1811.
